

Herbert L. Campbell II — a Washington area farmer who became a state politician, conservationist and community leader — died shortly after midnight Tuesday, March 10, 1998, at Washington County Hospital. The Washington resident was 87.

Funeral services have been scheduled for 1:30 p.m. Friday at the United Methodist Church in Washington with the Rev. Robert Bell and Charlie Morris officiating. Calling begins at 9 a.m. Thursday at the Jones-Eden Funeral Home in Washington. Family visitation begins at 6:30 p.m. Thursday. Interment will be in the Elm Grove Cemetery in Washington.

Memorial contributions may be made to the Washington Tree Committee and the Halcyon House Good Samaritan Fund.

Mr. Campbell was born Dec. 24, 1910 in Lucas County to Herbert L. and Clara (Holmes) Campbell. He graduated from Seymour High School and attended Iowa Wesleyan College.

In 1931, he married Neva Stacy in Brighton.

Mr. Campbell, who lived all his adult life in the Washington area, farmed for many years in the area. In the 1970s, he served four years in the Iowa House of Representatives.

He also helped organize the first soil conservation district in the area, won the "Master Farmer" award and was active in tree-planting efforts in the area. Mr. Campbell was also a member of the Rotary and the Y Men.

Last month, Mr. Campbell was featured in The Journal's "Tip of the

"Hat" column for his numerous volunteer efforts in the area. "I've always had lots of enthusiasm; that and optimism will take you a long way," he said during a February interview for the newspaper.

Mr. Campbell was a member of the United Methodist Church.

Survivors include: three sons, Herbert L. "Larry" Campbell III of Earle, Ark., Bruce M. Campbell of Washington and Rodney K. Campbell of Homewood, Ill.; one daughter, Linda Campbell of Chicago; 10 grandchildren; nine great-grandchildren; and a sister, Erma Bohrer of Laramie, Wyo.

He was preceded in death by his wife in 1983, his parents, a brother and a sister.
