Nathan F. "Fritz" Sorg, 75, a former Marion
pharmacist and Iowa legislator, died Saturday while
traveling near Hannibal, Mo.

Since retiring in 1975, he and Mrs. Sorg had made
their winter home at Holiday, Fla., and had spent
their summers in Iowa.

He was born at Hawkeye on Dec. 25, 1909, and
married the former Nellie Lyman Oct. 12, 1934. He
graduated from the University of Northern Iowa and
received a pharmacy degree and master's degree
from the University of Iowa. He taught in the U of I
College of Pharmacy from 1940 to 1945, when he
purchased the pharmacy in Marion.

Mr. Sorg served for 13 years on the Marion Water
Board and was a director of Farmers State Bank. He
was a member of Marion Masonic Lodge No. 6.

In 1966, he was elected to the Iowa legislature and
served until 1972.

Surviving in addition to his wife are two
daughters, Ruth Bernstein of Marion and Barbara
Lyford of Des Moines, and five grandchildren.

The body has been cremated. A memorial service
will be conducted 1 p.m. May 25 at Unity Center,
3791 Blairs Ferry Road NE.
