Horace Clinton Daggett

Horace C. Daggett, son of Mildred (Rundlett) and Donald Daggett, was born on May 15, 1931 in Adams County at Prescott, Iowa and entered into rest on June 16, 1998 at the age of 67 years, 1 month and 1 day with interment in the Evergreen Cemetery, Prescott, Iowa.

Horace, along with his two brothers, Brad and Max, grew up on a small farm approximately one mile south of Prescott. He frequently stated he had a wonderful boyhood exploring the Nodaway River and helping his dad, who was a mechanic, school bus driver and small acreage farmer.

He attended school at the Prescott Community School District where he played basketball, receiving honorable mention All-State recognition his senior year and graduated valedictorian in 1948.

Horace was united in marriage on September 28, 1952 with Ruth A. Foster, and to this union five children were born: Sherry, Dennis, Debra, Dale and Douglas.

Horace loved his family, and they were his first priority. He followed his children's and grandchildren's careers and activities with great interest, frequently attending their events.

Horace began farming in 1950 on 160 acres near Prescott and retired from that occupation in 1991. He was active in 4-H and American Farm Bureau, which he served as a local leader or president

at various times. Highlights of his farming career include his selection to the 4-H Congress in Chicago for field crops, the selection of his family as the WOW-TV (Omaha) farm family of the week, and the creation of the DA-SHA-MAY Grazing Association.

Horace's military career began in 1949 when he joined the Army National Guard in Corning, Iowa, as a member of the 168th Infantry. He concluded his career as Sergeant Major, one of the highest ranks attainable by non-commissioned personnel. Highlights of his military service included receipt of the Meritorious Service Medal and Award, the Army Achievement Medal and Award, and the national Guard Medal of Merit; each an award that recognized outstanding

performance and leadership.

Horace began his public life in 1968 with his election to the Lenox School board. In 1972 came his election to the Iowa House of Representatives from the 88th district in southwest Iowa. He served as State Representative for 24 years.

Among the numerous honors he received as an elected official was his 1996 selection as the Republican National Legislator of the year.

He lived his beliefs and practiced them faithfully as a member of the Grace Baptist Church of Corning and First Baptist Church of Creston. His participation in these churches included teaching adult classes as well as filling the office of

deacon during his membership at Grace Baptist. During these final months his thought often rested upon the Apostle Paul's words, "For me to live is Christ and to die is gain." Philippians 1:21.

Horace was preceded in death by his parents, daughter Sherry, and son Dale. Horace is survived by his wife Ruth; sons, Dennis (wife Cindy) and Douglas (wife Ellen); daughter, Debra (husband Lon Soukup); and ten grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Friday, June 19, 1998 at 10:00 a.m. at the First Baptist Church in Creston with Rev. Robert Sauser officiating. Burial was in the Evergreen Cemetery in Prescott. Visitation was held Thursday evening at Coen-Beaty Funeral Home in Creston.

Serving as pallbearers were: Paul Maynes, Don Johnston, Wayne Palmer, Loran Shaffer, Laverne McCarty and Bruce Travis, Sr. Jeanie Saylor as organist provided accompaniment as a trio of Rev. Dave Peters, Mike Henry, and Dennis Kuyper sang: "Lilly of the Valley", "Dare to Be Daniel" and the congregation joined in singing, "Victory In Jesus".

Graveside Military Rites were provided by the Iowa Army National Guard.

Lenox Board of Education
The Board of Education of the Lenox Community School District met in regular session, immediately following the closed session meeting interview the two finalists the 7-12 Principal position, Monday night, June 1, 1998. President Fehring determined that a quorum was present and called the meeting order at 8:10 p.m.

In Open Forum:
Cindy Baker addressed the Board about suggestions for the 1998-99 Hot Lunch Program pertaining to hourly rate and benefits for the 8-hour employees requested more time for the hour employees.

Cindy Baker left at 8:20 p.m. Todd and Meg Baker entered the meeting 8:26 p.m.

Diane Lange addressed the board and restated support to have 2 sections 1st grade this fall and was concerned about the agenda. She stated "if enrollment remains at 28 or more". She did recall a certain number had been set; only the consensus to advertise for another 1st grade teacher for now.

Motion was made Groust, seconded by Wurster adopt the amended agenda include additions: XIA.2 recommendation to employ Lance Evans for 1998-1999 Summer Band Lesson XI.E - Ed Douglas concern outdoor lighting and XIF IASB Dues for 1998-1999. Motion carried 4-0.
