### Albert L. Garrison Sr. (1927-2004)

WATERLOO — Albert L. Garrison Sr., 76, of Des Moines, formerly of Waterloo, died Saturday, April 3, at Iowa Methodist Medical Center, Des Moines, of a heart attack.

He was born Nov. 7, 1927, in Waterloo, son of Frank Sr. and Cora Rounds Garrison. He received his B.A. degree from Upper Iowa University, his B.S. degree from Drake University, and he also attended law school at Drake.

Mr. Garrison owned and operated Garrison Business Service in Waterloo and was a retired executive with Waterloo Industries.

He served in the U.S. Navy and as a reserve office in the U.S. Air Force. He retired from the reserves with the rank of major. He also served one term as a Democratic representative in the Iowa House of Representatives from 1977 to 1978, followed by his appointment as a Black Hawk County Magistrate.

Garrison also chaired the Waterloo Housing Commission and is believed to be the first African-American tax agent for the state of Iowa. He also was employed by the Federal Internal Revenue Service.
