For 20 years, Phil served in the House of Representatives for the State of Iowa as a Republican legislator. He won his first election in 1978 and retired from office in 2002.

He also served as mayor of North English for one term before being elected to the legislature, and he was an active member of the Rotary Club and the North English Fire Department.

After the children were older, Diane decided to work outside the home and joined the staff at Evans Photography in 1976. She continues to work for Lifetouch National School Studios today.


