
Man pleads guilty in tax case

Louis Charles Fisher, 59, will face up to three years in prison and a \$250,000 fine when he is sentenced on Feb. 9, 2001.

Ted James Anderson, 57, of the 10000 block of Clark Street, Clive, died of pancreatic cancer Wednesday at Mercy Medical Center. Cremation will follow visitation. Memorial services will be at 3 p.m. Monday at Hamilton's Funeral Home.

Mr. Anderson was born in Waterloo and had lived in Clive and Waterloo most of his life. He was a state senator from 1980 to 1984. He also was a core inspector with John Deere Waterloo Tractor Works and had worked as a lobbyist for 16 years. He was an Air Force veteran.

Former legislator, union activist Anderson dies at 57

Ted J. Anderson, 57, of Waterloo and Clive, died Wednesday at Mercy Hospital in Des Moines of pancreatic cancer.

Anderson graduated from Columbus High School in 1961 and served

in the U.S. Air Force for four years. When he returned from the military, he worked at Deere & Co., including service on a crew painting safety lines on gangways on the night shift.

But his real calling came as he rose through the United Auto Workers Union leadership locally.

His experiences in political action led to a run for the Iowa Senate in 1980, a campaign he won.

That success turned to disappointment four years later when he lost his re-election bid to Joy Coming of Cedar Falls.

Subsequently, Anderson became a lobbyist for the UAW and joined with other former legislators to represent the interests of a variety of clients interested in legislative action.
