In Keosauqua precinct 220 votes were cast for taxation and 59 against, making a majority of 161 for the tax. In Pittsburg precinct 103 votes were cast for taxation and 34 against, making 69 majority in favor of same. The total number of votes in the township for taxation was 323 and the number against was 93 making a net majority in Van Buren township of 230 for the tax.

**Another Pioneer Gone.**

David Doud, of Village township, after a short illness died at his residence on Friday March 24th 1882, in the 75th year of his age. He was born in Bradford Co., Pennsylvania; came to Iowa 1844 and located on his present farm. He leaves a wife and four children to mourn the loss of a kind husband and noble father. His disease was pluro-pneumonia.

Mr. Doud was one of the best citizens of Van Buren county. He represented this county in the Iowa Legislature in 1856; he was a man of positive opinions but kind, considerate and honest in all of his business transactions and charitable almost to a fault. He never turned the poor away empty handed, and was loved by all his neighbors and acquaintances.

He died without an enemy, and the mantle of sorrow falls heavily on the community where he lived. In life he visited the widows and fatherless and kept himself unspotted from the world.

In death we laid his mortal clay in the cold ground while his spirit returned to the God who gave it. We shall meet in a better world. X X




