years more would be left on the calendar at the close of 1892), and that was to be made expressly as a parade ground for the political clubs. He knew property holders who nearly went into convulsions when taxes were due and who kicked because they had to bear their burden of expense, and who piteously bewailed the fact that they were on the eve of going to the poor house; yet these same fellows would not sell their property for twice its real value. Nor would they replace their sixteenth century shanties for modern structures because more valuable property meant increased taxation. He knew capitalists who would begrudge a laboring \$1.50 for fourteen hours work and carelessly pass their lawyer a five-dollar bill for gar money. There were citizens, Jinglesby knew, who never ceased kicking because the city was liberal in manufacturing concerns that employed hundreds of people to earn a good living. And if these factories were to accept some of the highly flattering offers and remove elsewhere, the same kickers would never cease kicking themselves until they kicked the bucket." Some people kicked because it was proposed to pull an uptown switch and thus open up a great manufacturing district in the heart of the city—some because there would be more smoke ascend from tall chimneys; others because it would enhance the value of their property and possibly cause a higher rating in the assessor's books. About ten thousand newspaper readers in the city kick without the slightest provocation (so Jinglesby's friend, a newspaper man, told him)—some because there was nothing sensational or scandalous or horrifying or blood-urdling in one issue of the paper, and the next day others kick because there was; some because every preacher's

These and many other kickers Jinglesby likened to Bro. Tolliver in that they were justifiable. And who shall say him nay?

The Demise of That Pioneer Citizen Occurs Last Night.

Citizens of Keokuk and Lee county will be pained to learn of the demise at 9 o'clock last night of Thomas Sawyer. For seven weeks he had suffered from la grippe, and death resulted from exhaustion following the ravages of the disease. He was born in Warren county, Ohio, July 5, 1813, and in 1836 was married to Miss Eliza Snodgrass, who died in this city ten years ago. In 1850 they came to Lee county, settling upon a farm in Pleasant Ridge township. Fifteen years later he removed to Montrose township and continued his occupation as a farmer until ten years ago when he retired and came to Keokuk, occupying the residence at No. 606 Grand avenue. He was highly prosperous and acquired large property interests.

In 1856 he was elected to represent Lee county in the state legislature and served one term. He was a member of the Presbyterian church and was an elder in the church at Montrose until his removal to Keokuk when he united with Westminster church. In 1866 he was a delegate to the general assembly of the church at Cleveland, O. He was a man of powerful build and of rugged integrity of character.

There survive him the following children: Mrs. C. L. Carpenter and

sermon was not printed, and because sporting and dramatic news is published, others because so much space was given to religious matters; some because the party given by them didn't get a column, others because the list of guests was printed; some because initials only were used in mentioning their names, others because the Christian names were given in full; some because for prudential reasons and the welfare of those concerned everything that happened didn't get into print, others because something concerning them did—some on one excuse some another and always when the paper is not full of news, whether anything unusual has occurred or not, and always without justification. And as Bro. Tolliver did Axtel, Jinglesby thought all these kickers—save the agile disciples of Terpsichore, the ladies, God bless 'em—should be given a dose of their own medicine. When those cow-hide boots came in contact with the mule's stomach, there was immediate peace; and if the chronic kickers were given a similar homeopathic dose, maybe they would be cured, for pessimism is often traceable to a disordered stomach.

But as Bro. Tolliver's kicking was deserving of applause, so, Jinglesby reasoned, there are many kickers who should be encouraged. These are they who kick for paved streets and more frequent repair and renovation of the macadam roadways. Who are righteously wrathful when they can't find a street because it is not marked nor a house because in is not numbered. Merchants who pay taxes and contribute to the furtherance of all public enterprises and are forced to compete with tramp merchants who neither. I.; was at the battles of Corinth, Iuka and Jackson; was captured at the battle of Lookout Mountain; was imprisoned first at Belle Isle; then transferred to Andersonville, where he remained nine months; was then removed to Charleston, thence to Florence and Wilmington and paroled after being a prisoner fourteen months; was discharged the 15th of April, 1865.

SAWYER, THOMAS, farmer, Sec. 9; P. O. Montrose; was born in Warren Co., Ohio, in 1813. He married in 1836 Eliza Snodgrass, born in Dauphin Co., Penn., in 1815; Mr. Sawyer came to Lee Co. in 1850, and located

in Pleasant Ridge Tp.; removed to Montrose and settled on the farm he now owns in 1865. Has seven children—Mary J. (now Mrs. C. L. Carpenter, of Sandusky, Iowa), Martha S., Silas N., Blanche A. (now Mrs. R. H. Younkin), William, Elizabeth (now Mrs. Letts, of Clay Co., Ill.), and Priscilla B. Mr. Sawyer was elected to the Legislature in 1856, served one term.
