Galen M. Davis, 54, died at 10:25 a.m. February 7, 2005 at Mahaska Health Partnership in Oskaloosa from injuries sustained in an auto accident on Highway 21, south of Highway 92 in Keokuk County.

Mr. Davis was a 30 year veteran police officer for the City of Ottumwa and was promoted to Police Sergeant in August 1987. He had worked as Supervisor of Investigations Division, Supervisor of Southeast Iowa Inter-Agency Drug Task Force, Police Department Training Officer, Watch Commander and Field Sergeant of Patrol Shifts.

He was elected Iowa State Representative for the 93rd District, serving in the 78th General Assembly from 1999 to 2001. He was an active member of the Republican Party.

Surviving are two sons, Joey Davis and Tyler Davis, both of Ottumwa; a granddaughter, Chelsea Davis; a special friend, Diane Orfanos of What Cheer and her children, Alexis, Angelo and Maria; three brothers, Richard Davis of Bay Minette, AL, Chuck Davis of Buena Park, CA, and Leonard Davis of Crocker, MO; and a sister, Mary Doty of Knoxville, TN.

He was preceded in death by his parents and a brother, Robert Davis.

Funeral services will be 3 p.m. Friday at Reece Funeral Home with Bill Payne officiating. Military services will be conducted by O.B. Nelson Post #3 American Legion and Walter B. Schafer Post #775 Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Members of the Ottumwa Police Force will serve as honorary casket bearers. Cremation will follow the services.

Visitation will begin after 10 a.m. today at the funeral home, with the family present from 5 to 8 p.m. In lieu of flowers, memorials may be made to the Ottumwa Policemen's Association.
