**Death of Hon. P. G. Baily.**  
 It is with deep sadness that we chronicle the death of Mr. Baily, which occurred on Monday evening of this week. When we went to press last week it was supposed that he was much better and almost past danger; but he was taken worse on Friday and it was at once known that the crisis had passed unfavorably, and that he could not recover. All the most eminent medical aid that could be obtained was brought into requisition but to no purpose.

Mr. Baily has for years been one of the most prominent men in Grand Meadow township and Clayton county, universally respected and esteemed by all who knew him for his excellent qualities of head and heart. His death creates a vacancy not only in his family circle but in the township and county, that cannot be filled. To the bereaved family and friends we extend our sincere condolence.

The funeral took place from the family residence on Thursday, and was very largely attended. Rev. J. W. Ward preached the discourse, and the funeral was conducted by the Clermont Masonic Fraternity, of which Mr. Baily was a member. The Postville lodge participated in a body. The remains were interred in the Postville cemetery.
