His wife lives on the farm, on Section 5; P. O. St. Donatus.

Married Mary Madden in 1870; she was born in Ireland; had four children, three living--Elizabeth, Margaret and Laura T.; lost Mary in 1871, aged 13 months. Enlisted in 1861, in Co. F, 10th Wis. V. I.; was taken prisoner in September, 1865, at the battle of Chickamauga; released in 1865.


