Sunday morning the sad news came from Topeka of the death of the Hon. T. W. Harrison of that place. He now holds a goodly number of acres of Palo Alto county land and also a lot of town property in Emmetsburg. He was a tireless worker and was ever on the alert for some real estate investment. He was a brother-in-law of W. J. Brown and Geo. B. McCarty of this city. He had many friends in this city who will regret his death. His brother Albert Harrison also resides in this city. The interment will be made at Topeka. Monday forenoon Mr. and Mrs. McCarty, Mrs. Brown and Albert Harrison left to attend the funeral. We presume that it will be held Wednesday.
