Mr. Juergen Mordhorst died at 7:00 o'clock in the morning of January 8, 1916, at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Geo. Mumm, at Herman, Minn., where he was visiting at the time.

The deceased was born in Holstein, Germany, Feb. 18, 1844, and at the time of his death was aged 71 years, 10 months and 29 days.

He served in the German army and was a veteran of the Franco-Prussian

With his wife he came to this country in the year 1899. His wife, Henrietta, passed away in 1913.

He is survived by the following children: Mrs. Henry Fedde, of Gretna, Neb., Mr. Adolph Mordhorst, living northeast of Reinbeck, Mrs. Geo. Mumm, of Herman, Minn., Mrs. John Mumm, of Dodge Center, Iowa, Mrs. Albert Bons, living in Holstein, Germany.

The remains were brought to this city and short funeral services were held at the grave Monday at 1:30. Interment was in the Reinbeck cemetery.

Mr. Petersen came to Reinbeck when there were but few people here. He laid out a portion of the town, the land of which he then owned and many of the town lots bear the description of being located in Petersen's addition.

He was in the furniture and hardware business here for a number of years, being associated at one time with the late Chris. Rohlfis in the hardware and machinery business.

Some thirty years ago he was for one-term representative in the state legislature from Grundy county.

About 27 or 28 years ago he moved to California where he has since resided.

This database is an index to individuals enumerated in the 1900 United States Federal Census, the Twelfth Census of the United States. Census takers recorded many details including each person's name, address, relationship to the head of household, color or race, sex, month and year of birth, age at last birthday, marital status, number of years married, the total number of children born of the mother, the number of those children living, birthplace, birthplace of father and mother, if the individual was foreign born, the year of immigration and the number of years in the United States, the citizenship status of foreign-born individuals over age twenty-one, occupation, and more.
