### Sam Corrie

Long prominent in the affairs  
of Ida Grove and Ida county  
and esteemed for his interest  
in his fellowmen, Samuel Main  
Corrie, son of William and Isa-  
bella Corrie, died at his home  
here at 9 p. m. May 16 after  
several months of failing health.  
Born at New York City Sep-  
tember 15, 1858, he was 83  
years, 8 months and 1 day old  
when he died.

At the age of four he was  
brought by his parents to Cedar  
county, Iowa, where he grew to  
maturity and where also he mar-  
ried Elizabeth Garner November  
10, 1880, at the Fairview church.  
The three daughters and six sons  
born to them all survive their  
father.

The Corries moved to a farm  
in Hayes township in 1890, thence  
to Ida Grove in 1913, where his  
wife died December 20, 1916.  
Some time later he married Pearl  
Babcock of Ida Grove. He was  
affiliated in religious faith with  
the Church of God, to which he  
had been converted early in life.

#### First Representative

Besides taking an active inter-  
est in the work of the church, Mr.  
Corrie was always interested in  
community and local political af-  
fairs. He became the first rep-  
resentative from Ida county after  
each Iowa county was given a  
representative in the lower  
branch of the legislature. As such  
he served two terms, 1907 to 1911.  
For a number of years he was  
president of the Cornbelt Meat  
Producers association.

As a husband and father he was  
kind and devoted. In addition to  
his wife, surviving are his nine  
children—Mrs. Ada Luscombe,  
Sioux City; Mrs. Nellie Pilcher,  
Lawton; Mary Earl, Richmond,  
Calif.; Will, Des Moines; Harry,  
Anthon; Homer and Donald, Ida  
Grove; Paul, Bronson, Ia.; and  
Bruce, Richmond, Calif.; 16 grand-  
children, 18 great grandchildren,  
and a sister, Mrs. Will Johnson,  
Ida Grove.

Rev. R. M. Hudson officiated  
at final services from the Church  
of God here Tuesday afternoon.  
Interment was in the Ida Grove  
cemetery. Pallbearers were the  
six sons.
