### Harold Holmgren, 77 Of Lone Rock, Dies Friday

LONE ROCK - Harold Holmgren, 77 of Lone Rock, died at the Bethesda Hospital in Fort Dodge Friday. He died following major surgery but had been ill for only a few days.

Funeral services were held Monday morning at the Good Hope Methodist church at Lone Rock. The Rev. B. McDonald officiated and the Gary funeral home of Bancroft was in charge of arrangements. Burial was in the Union cemetery at Humboldt.

Harold was born April 20, 1896 at Stillson, Iowa, son of John and Mattie Holmgren. He graduated from high school in Ruthven in 1915 and Iowa State University in 1923 where he received a degree in Animal Husbandry.

He received a scholarship from Coe College but this was interrupted by service in the Navy. Mr. Holmgren was a member of the Iowa State Legislature from 1928-30 as a representative from Palo Alto County.

He taught school and coached at Sheriton for two years and farmed for eight years south of Lone Rock. He received the Pioneer Lawmakers Award from the Iowa State Legislature.

Mr. Holmgren was married to Ellen Hamerson at Humboldt on May 5, 1933. The couple came to Kossuth County in 1942.

There are no children. His wife survives as does a brother Iver of Ruthven, and sisters Mrs. Etta Culver of Roseda, Calif. and Mrs. H.A. Manhafer of South Island City, Neb.

He was active in the Isaac Walton Kossuth Lodge and Burt Eastern Stars and was a charter member of the American Legion. Military services were conducted at the grave by the Ker-Hammerstrom Legion post of Burt.

He was active on rural boards and community affairs. In 1946 he returned from farming and moved to Fergus Falls where he worked with the Thomas O. Nelson Atlas Co.

Surviving are his wife, four sons and four daughters; Donald and Robert of Fergus Falls; Lloyd of Foxhome; and Edwin, Renton, Wash.; Mrs. Lucille Olson, Chula Vista, Calif.; Velma, Mrs. Bill Anderson, Keokuk; Phyllis, Mrs. Donald Balfour, Fergus Falls; and Betty, Mrs. Donald Hammers, Creston.

Also surviving is a sister, Mrs. Anna Hanselman of LuVerne; 29 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren.
