Funeral Services

Hutcheon

Funeral services were held Sunday, Aug. 13, from the Slininger Chapel in Jefferson for W. E. S. Hutcheon, 82, retired Jefferson attorney and longtime Greene county resident.

The Rev W. F. Schneck of Jefferson officiated. Mrs David Carlstrom was organist. Honorary bearers were Kenneth Parrish, Ralph Maloney and Herman Lorensen.

Casket bearers were Dr E. D. Thompson, Howard Nash, Robert Horak, Don Hall, James Pauley and Curtis Wilson. Interment was in Jefferson Cemetery.

William Emslie Scott, son of James and Elsie Yeats Hutcheon, was born May 30, 1896, near Farnhamville in Calhoun county. At six years of age he moved with his parents to Greene county where he attended rural school and the Jefferson High School.

He graduated in 1913. Emslie then attended the University of Iowa, earning his bachelor's degree in 1918.

Mr Hutcheon served with the U.S. Army during World War One in the rank of second lieutenant. In 1923 he received his law degree from the University of Iowa.

Emslie married Elsie Hubbard Feb. 20, 1924, at Elliott. They were the parents of two children, James and Jean.

Except for a brief period while he was a Representative in the Iowa Legislature in 1930, Mr Hutcheon lived his entire adult life in Jefferson where he practiced law.

In 1929 he served as county attorney for Greene county. He was a member of the Greene County and Iowa Bar Associations and past president of the Jefferson school board.

Emslie was also a member of the Floyd Brown Post No. 11 of the American Legion and Morning Star Lodge No. 159 A.F. &

A.M., both for over 50 years.

He was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Jefferson, having served in the offices of deacon, trustee and elder.

Mr Hutcheon died Friday, Aug. 11, at the Greene County Medical Center. He was preceded in death by his parents.

His survivors include his wife, Elsie; his children, James Hutcheon of Waterloo and Jean Stone of Thiensville, WI, and five grandchildren, Randall, Pamela and Gregory Stone, Deborah Hutcheon Hansen and Jeffrey Hutcheon.
