Tallman Injured

PERRY (AP) — A Minnesota truck driver was fined \$19 in justice court here today for failing to properly halt at a stop sign. A resulting accident brought minor injuries to Iowa commerce commissioner and Mrs. John A. Tallman, of Des Moines.

Authorities said the Tallmans were headed north for Humboldt when a truck and trailer outfit, driven by Archie Edward Sharp of Blue Earth, Minn., failed to make the stop at the intersection of Highways 169 and 141, four miles east of Perry.

Sharp braked but lost control of his machine, Highway Patrolman Wendell Stream reported, causing the trailer to swing across the highway. Tallman nearly stopped his car but the trailer hit the front end of his machine in its swing.

He and Mrs. Tallman were treated at Dallas County hospital, Perry, Tallman for a bruised shoulder and his wife a lacerated knee. Both were later released. Damage to the car was estimated at \$600.

The car was owned by the commerce commission.

Berton Metcalf, Nichols, Dies; Plan Services

NICHOLS—Berton L. Metcalf, 88, of Nichols, a former Iowa legislator, died Thursday night at University hospital in Iowa City.

Mr. Metcalf was born in Ohio in 1868 and came to Iowa in a covered wagon with his parents when he was nine months old. He has lived in the Nichols area since that time. He was married to Ina G. Hankins April 6, 1893.

He was a former Democratic state representative from Muscatine county and a retired farmer and cattle feeder. He was also a mayor of Nichols, served on the town council, and served for 20 years on the school board.

He was a member of the Christian church, Masonic lodge, Odd Fellows and Modern Woodmen.

Survivors are a son, Clarence, and a daughter, Mrs. Alberta Kelly, both of Nichols. His wife preceded him in death.

Services are planned Sunday in the Christian church at Nichols. The body is at the Snider funeral home in West Liberty.



Nichols — Scores of different items have been donated for the Harvest sale which is being sponsored by the Men's club to commemorate the 75th anniversary of the Christian church in Nichols. Dewey Gibson, West Liberty, will auction the items in the area south of the Nichols park Saturday. Perishable items will be displayed in the depot in the event of inclement weather.

Items ranging from radio-record player combinations and the White House etching to pressure cookers and antiques have been donated by persons in Nichols, Muscatine, West Liberty, Lone Tree, Iowa City, Conesville, Cedar Rapids and the Quad-Cities. Many persons are offering farm produce such as grain, baled straw, live and dressed poultry, canned goods, potatoes, apples, fresh fruits and vegetables and cured hams. Baked goods and candy will go on the block along with lamps, furniture, oil, grease, merchandise coupons, groceries, handmade rugs and a subscription to the Muscatine Journal.

Lunch will be served from a small building near the depot by women of the Delta Alpha society. Mrs. Lloyd Longstreth is chairman of the committee in charge. Art Grim is chairman of the Men's club which is promoting the sale. Proceeds realized will be placed in the building fund to improve and enlarge the church building which will be 75 years old on Saturday. The congregation organized 83 years ago and began building their church eight years later.

Special services will be offered Sunday as homecoming for the many persons who have been members of the congregation and for several of the former pastors who are expected to attend. B. L. Metcalf, chairman of the board and an elder in the congregation, will give a history of the church and congregation. The Rev. Mina Hargis, a former pastor, will offer a history of the church brotherhood. A potluck dinner will be served at Mills hall following the services.

He served as Pike Township Assessor for eight years, Township Trustee for one term and served as secretary and director of Adams School, hiring many of the teachers who taught in the Adams District. He was a member of Nichols Lodge No. 4195 Modern Woodmen of America; Adams Lodge No. 352 M. B.A., and Nichols Lodge No. 664 I.O.O.F. In religious faith, he was a Protestant. He died 1 Feb 1927. Laura, a devoted housewife and mother, died 26 May 1941. They are buried in the Nichols Cemetery.

GERTIE SMITH

Gertie Smith did wallpapering for three generations of Nichols families. She lived on a little acreage on the north edge of town, where she kept a horse, cow and pigs. She always wore a painter's cap, cotton dress and big apron, or sometimes trousers, especially when she was papering a stair well and straddled the banister, even when she was over seventy years old.

One day she was tired at work because she had been up all night helping her pet sow deliver pigs in the barn.

Hub Elder presented Gertie with a trophy at the West Liberty Fairgrounds for being the oldest person to ride her horse to a riding contest.

The daughter of a Scottish minister, she was well read, and neighbors enjoyed her interesting tales while visiting at mealtime during the days she spent beautifying their walls while papering.

NORRIS BROTHERS

Two Norris brothers lived in Nichols: Richard and his wife in the south part of town; Tom and "Ellie" where the Dick Hanfts live. The latter Norrises were the grand parents of Helen Tatge.

BERTON L. METCALF--INA LEE HANKINS

Ina Hankins and Berton Metcalf were married on April 6, 1893, at the home of the bride's parents, Timothy and Elizabeth Lee Hankins, who lived three miles south of Nichols.

At the age of ten months, Berton came from Upper Sandusky, Ohio, in a covered wagon with his parents, Melissa Jane and Reuben, his two older brothers, Harvey and James, and his sister, Harriet. Another sister, Nettie, was born after they came west. Ina's parents came before the Civil War and were from Virginia and Ohio. Both Ina's and Berton's ancestors were English in origin.

Ina attended Brockway School and the Muscatine

Academy. She was a music teacher and a homemaker. Berton attended Siloam School. His father and brother James died when he was 10. He served his community as a member of the local school board and as mayor; his county as a state representative for three terms during the Franklin D. Roosevelt administration; and his federal government on several commissions during the great depression of the 1930s. He was on the county Draft Board during World War II.

Ina and Berton were the parents of two children: Clarence, born on May 13, 1895, and Alberta, born on March 11, 1899. Clarence married Verda Shannon on April 6, 1921 in Muscatine; they were parents of two sons. Alberta married William S. Kelly at the Christian Church in Iowa City on January 6, 1923.

Clarence graduated from West Liberty and attended a short course at Ames. He became a partner with his father, dealing in livestock and farming. Alberta graduated from Davenport High School, received B.A. and M.A. degrees from The University of Iowa. She was a teacher, a politician and a homemaker. During the Kennedy and Johnson administrations, Clarence was one of the three state agriculture chairmen in Des Moines.

Ina died in 1933, Berton in 1957, Verda in 1965 and Clarence in 1977. They and the two sons of Verda and Clarence are buried in the Nichols Cemetery.

The name Metcalf supposedly goes back to 1046, when the king awarded land in Yorkshire, England, to his warriors. The land resembled three calves lying down; the middle calf was ours, from which the name evolved.

My great grandfather James and his wife, Jane Jolly, were the parents of nine children. Their eldest son George was married and did not come to America until after the family came in the early 1800s to Bellevue, Ohio. Reuben, our grandfather, was 12 years of age. Eliza, a young sister, after a shipboard illness, was buried at sea. Two daughters, Hannah Mallory and Mary Greenslade, were born in America. They visited us in Nichols when I was ten. It was my job to take up their pre-breakfast tea. I still have the tea pot they gave me.

Grandmother Metcalf was the only grandparent I knew. Her grandfather, Cyrus Call, was a pre-revolutionary missionary among the Indians. She was the support of her family after the early death of her husband and oldest son. Her Nichols home is where the Weydels now live. Three first cousins were born in that home on May 13, two years apart, an odd coincidence.

To Clyde Hankins, a double cousin of my mother, I am indebted for the Lee-Hankins genealogy. He was an engineer on the Minneapolis to St. Louis Rocket that came through Nichols at midnight, and he always "tooted" twice as he came through. He and his son went to England twice to trace ancestry.

The Hankins family in England were Hankinsons; the Lees were Leighs. John G. Lee and his wife, Elizabeth Lowman, were my great great grandparents; she was a cousin of Martha Custis. Their sons, Richard Lee, my great grandfather, was a first cousin of Robert E. Lee.

There is a tie that binds us in our Nichols area. All of our ancestors have come from "across the waters." Those with living descendants must feel the joy of continuity.

FRED BUSH

Fred Bush, of more recent history, was also a loner. Like Tom London, he liked the woods. He worked for the Fred Mapes family and insisted on sleeping in their hay loft. When he became older, he bought the house where the Russell Grims live. He ate his meals at the Rice Cafe -- always pancakes and sausage for breakfast. After Fred died, authorities found money he had squirreled away all around his home and in two neighborhood banks. He must have worried about having enough for his old age, for no one knew his relatives.

Jack Salemink, the oldest son of Harry and Bernice (Kremer) Salemink, lives two and a half miles west of Nichols.

Harry Salemink's mother, Antonia, was born in Holland. Harry met Bernice at Olivia, Minnesota, where he had gone to work as a harvest hand during the grain threshing season.

Jack has one brother, Eugene, and one sister, Phyllis. All three attended Wild Rose School and graduated from Nichols High School. Jack and Gene were active in 4-H livestock projects.

Jack attended Iowa State College at Ames, Iowa, for two years. He and Helene Porter, daughter of James D. and Lottie (DeVault) Porter, were married 24 Oct 1950. Jack was driving a bus for the Nichols School at that time, and Helene was working for Brugman Grocery.

They started farming in the spring of 1951 on the Tom Dean farm south of Nichols, but Jack was drafted in August and sent to Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, for basic training. Helene joined him for a time in the spring of 1952, and they lived in Rollo, Missouri. Jack was sent to France via Camp Carson, Colorado, Oakland, California, and the Panama Canal -- a three-week boat trip. He was at Orleans, France, from November 1952 until August 1953. By that

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Honorable Berton L. Metcalf, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

Berton L. Metcalf was born in Sandusky County, Ohio, in 1868, and came to Iowa in a covered wagon with his parents, Reuben and Melissa Metcalf, when nine months old. He passed away June 14, 1957, at the age of 89 years. His father died when he was nine years old, and he had to help with farm work during summer, while attending school in winter. At the age of twenty, he commenced farming for himself and four years later, April 6, 1893, was married to Ina G. Hankins. To this union were born two children, Clarence and Alberta.

Mr. Metcalf and his son operated their 620 acre farm, grain farming and livestock feeding, near Nichols, Iowa.

He was a member of the Christian church; Masonic Mohassen Grotto; I.O.O.F.; Modern Woodmen; and Royal Neighbor lodges. For twenty consecutive years he served on the school board of the independent district.

Mr. Metcalf was elected to the House of Representatives from Muscatine county to serve in the Forty-fifth, Forty-fifth Extra, and Forty-sixth sessions of the General Assembly. He was a Democrat in politics.

Therefore, Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Fifty-eighth General Assembly of Iowa: That in the passing of the Honorable Berton L. Metcalf, the state has lost an honored citizen, and the House by this resolution would express its appreciation of his service, and tender its sympathy to the members of his family.


