# County market hog show next Thursday

Winnebago county farmers reminded of the market hog show to be held next Thursday, Sept. 7, at Thompson, beginning at 7 p. m. The show, which is open to swine producers in the county, will be held at the junior grounds in Thompson. Pigs will be weighed, painted, and tattooed from 4:30 p. m. on show day. Barrows or gilts to be used for show must weigh between 180 and 240 lbs. Cut-out information will be provided on all sides by Geo. A. Hornel & Co. of Austin and the carcasses will be placed according to the ham-loin index system. This system is based on the percent of ham, as compared to the total carcass weight, plus size of the loin expressed in square inches. As long as minimum standards are met with regard to side length and backfat, no side is given to these officials under this method of scoring. Minimum standards must also be met on these two characteristics to qualify for the carcass class. Cash prizes totaling \$260 will be awarded plus trophies for the two places in each class to be given. Ribbons for the 10 places in each class will be given. Like Gaskill, Lake Mills Community School vocational culture teacher, stated by businessmen throughout the county have contributed to the expenses of the show and should be commended for their interest and cooperation in organizing the first county wide

market hog show ever to be held. "Your attendance, either as an exhibitor or a spectator, is encouraged." Bill Hemm of Sheffield, a purebred Spot breeder, will be the judge of the show. Winnebago Custom Farm Service will provide ham sandwiches and drink at the show. ## Ole Kringlaak died Sunday, funeral Tuesday

Funeral services for Ole Kringlaak, 82, were held at 2 p. m. Tuesday at Winnebago Lutheran. The Rev. I. B. Sorensen officiated. Burial was in the church cemetery, with Mittelstadt Funeral Home in charge. Mr. Kringlaak died Sunday morning at the Lake Mills Nursing Home. The son of Olav A. and Torbjor Selveit Kringlaak, he was born Oct. 4, 1889, in Mt. Valley Township, Winnebago County. He attended rural schools and graduated from Waldorf College in 1909. He was baptized at Winnebago Lutheran Church and Confirmed at Beaver Creek Church by the Rev. J. M. Dahl. He homesteaded in Schafer, N. D., and served in France during World War I. He was secretary and vice president of Worth Mutual Insurance, was elected to the state legislature in 1935, was secretary of the Cooperative Services of Lake Mills and was a director of Midland Coop and president of the Joice Coop Elevator. He was Sunday School teacher and superintendent at Winnebago Lutheran Church. He never was married. In 1966 he retired and entered the nursing home. Surviving are a sister, Galena, and a brother, Aslak, on the home farm in rural Lake Mills. He was preceded in death by a sister and two brothers in infancy.
