He served twice as Iowa representative at the Missouri River Development Conference, and was president of the Jeffersonian Davenport Democratic Group.

His memberships included the church, Knights of Columbus, American Legion and Iowa Governors Committee for Employment of the Handicapped.

He composed music and had several successful albums, some recorded by local artists Marjorie Meinert and George Sontag.
