A ten-minute "stretcher" after one and a half or two hours of driving will mean more relaxed and rested vacationers during your summer auto trip, observes Professor Gladys Scott, chairman of the women's physical education department at the State University of Iowa.

A wayside park is a good place for both adults and children to stretch, walk or run. But a stroll down the streets of a town will provide the exercise you need after a few hours of constant riding. A few "toe-toucher," body twisters or ther "calisthenics" are also advisable, says Dr. Scott.

A planned schedule to stop is important, and that schedule should be followed faithfully every day for long-range effects, Dr. Scott explains. You may not travel as far each day, but you will arrive at your destination less weary. Frequent stops will also help forestall the boredom which can develop from the monotony and hypnotic effect of road travel.

Correct posture as you ride or drive will lessen fatigue, says the SUI professor. Also, be sure you have adequate ventilation in the car. Perhaps one of the most important aids to relaxed travel is enough room to move, "squirm" and stretch. A good job of packing can insure plenty of room for passengers to move about. Because seat belts are confining, they are also fatiguing, Dr. Scott explains. Thus, wearing them will increase need for stops to stretch.

Change positions with other passengers frequently. Moving from front to back seat will also relieve the monotony of one position.

Feet will swell if they are overheated or if circulation is hampered because of inactivity. If this happens, take off your shoes and "wriggle" your toes or move your feet in a circular pattern. Elevating the feet while in the car or in a picnic area will rest them and reduce swelling.

Eyestrain, a familiar mark of car travel, can be lessened by deliberately switching your gaze from short-range objects to points in the distance. When you are not driving, do not follow the driver's range of vision, which is fairly narrow, monotonous and tiring. Close your eyes from time to time for reducing eyestrain.

However, closing the eyes is not suggested for persons who are prone to motion sickness, which brings up another problem in car travel. Car sickness will add to travel tension and fatigue, so do not try to eliminate this travel "dampener." Concentrate on ob-

Death Claims W. G. Wood

Funeral services for W. G. Wood of Albia were at First Christian church Wednesday afternoon.

Mr. Wood, former Albia postmaster and mayor who also served Monroe county as state representative, died at Monroe hospital early Monday.

In charge of the services was the Rev. Daniel C. Kechel. Pallbearers were Jud Hersman, John Griffin, Elmer Williams, Tom Richter, Frank Parry and W. A. Henley. Masonic burial rites were at Oak View cemetery.

Mr. Wood was 85 years old. He was born in Albia May 15, 1873.

He was prominent in public life and in business. He began his business career here as a cigar maker and also was a partner in a hardware firm. More recently he was a public relations representative for Iowa Southern Utilities Company.

He was Albia postmaster from 1920 until 1933, and served in the legislature after leaving that post. He served several terms as mayor, and was chairman of the board of Albia public library trustees. He was a 62-year Mason and a past master of the Albia lodge. He was a member of First Christian church.

Survivors are two sons, John R. Wood of Albia and George Wood of Washington, D. C., and six grandchildren. Mrs. Wood died in 1945 and he also was preceded in death by a daughter, Mrs. Mildred Darby, in 1933.

WILLIAM G. WOOD

MR. SPEAKER: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character and public service of the late Honorable William G. Wood, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

William G. Wood was born on a farm near Albia, Iowa, May 15, 1873, and passed away June 30, 1958, at the age of 85 years. His parents, John H. Wood and Mary J. Van Schoiack Wood, were pioneer residents of Monroe county.

He was educated in the public schools and the high school of Albia.

On May 8, 1895, he was married to Alice M. Jewell of Geneva, Nebraska, and to this union three children were born: Mildred Lucile, deceased, George W. and John R.

Mr. Wood lived most of his life in Albia, and began his business career there as a cigar maker. He was a partner in the hardware firm of Darby & Wood. In recent years he was public relations representative for the Iowa Southern Utilities Company.

A 62-year Mason, he was a past master of the Albia lodge and a member of the White Shrine. He was a member of First Christian church.

Mr. Wood was postmaster from 1920 until 1933, and was elected to the Legislature after leaving that office, serving in the Forty-seventh and Forty-eighth sessions of the General Assembly.

He was a close friend and political adviser to the late Nate Kendall, who served as governor and in Congress.

He is survived by two sons, John R. Wood of Albia and George Wood of Washington, D. C., and six grandchildren. He was preceded in death by a daughter, Mrs. Mildred Darby, in 1933, and by his wife in 1945.

Therefore, Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Fifty-eighth General Assembly of Iowa: That in the passing of the Honorable William G. Wood the state has lost an honored citizen and a faithful, useful servant, and the House, by this resolution, would express its appreciation of his service, and tender its sympathy to the members of his family.

Be It Further Resolved: That a copy of this resolution be spread upon the Journal of the House and that the Chief Clerk be directed to forward an enrolled copy to the family of the deceased.
