## Former Publisher Dies Monday

C. E. Baldwin, 67, died at the Ottumwa Hospital Monday, Oct. 14 at 11 a.m. where he had been a patient since Oct. 11.

Mr. Baldwin was born at Fremont, Nebr. and in 1913 was united in marriage to Mary Mitze.

He came to Eddyville in 1919 as superintendent of schools and served 14 years as the head of the schools here. He was then appointed board secretary and served in that capacity for 20 years. In 1931 he purchased the Eddyville Tribune from K. C. Crabb and published that newspaper until Oct. 1950.

In 1942, he was elected to the House of Representatives and served until 1944.

Mr. Baldwin was a graduate of State Teachers' College, Cedar Falls, and received his master's degree at the University of Iowa.

He was a member of the Congregational church and for a number of years taught a Sunday school class here. He was also a member of the Masons.

He is survived by his wife, Mary; one brother, Cloyd, Independence,

Funeral arrangements were in charge of the Eddyville Co-operative Burial Association. Services were held at the Congregational church Thursday with Rev. Harold Cupery in charge. Burial was made at Highland cemetery.
