
THE J.C.C.'s

STARK FAMILY

Frederick Berlin was born in 1836 to Ludwig and Dorothea Schwenn Berlin in Prussia, one of three children. The father died 10 years later and the mother remarried to Joachim Stark in 1854. Frederick was only one to take the Stark name.

The family immigrated to America, to Mitchell County, Iowa, six miles south of Riceville. Frederick married Bertah Peitzke, born 1846, daughter of Ferdinand and Wilhelmina Kant Petizke. They had seven children: Charles, Anna, Fred, Henry, Minnie, Frank and Louis. Charles and Fred were the only ones to remain in this area.

Charles Stark, born 1865, married Johanna Schmidt and farmed South of Riceville. They had seven children: Katherine, Ruth, Esther, Edwin, Grace, Minnie and Floyd. Esther, Grace, and Minnie died early in life and Edwin was the only other one to remain in this area.

Edwin Stark, born 1893, married Mary Scanlon and farmed SE of Riceville. They had two sons, Vincent and Charles J. Vincent, born 1929, married Charlene Anderlik, daughter of Norbert and Lilly Kempf Anderlik, and they have two sons: Kenneth D. married Sandra Watson, daughter of Ben and Eileen Johnson Watson, and they have two children in Mason City; and Donald is in Waterloo. Charles J. moved away.

Fred Stark, born 1868, married Elizabeth Vollbrecht, born 1869, to Fred and Caroline Helwig Vollbrecht. They farmed 10 years south of Riceville and then moved to a farm five miles east of Riceville, in Sec. 24 of Jamestown Twp. They had five children: Harvey, Eddie who died in infancy; Myra, Roy and Paul.

Harvey Stark, born 1891, married Marion Torney, born 1893, and daughter of Richard E. and Lola Mosher Torney and farmed three miles NE of Riceville in Sec. 22 of Jamestown Twp. They had five children: Merle died at age 4, Mildred, Elinor died at 7 months, Raymond and Glendon. Mildred, born 1921, married Harlan Martens and had two children: Rodney and Rene Jean. Raymond, born 1926, married Loretta Jordan, daughter of Sam and Caroline Musel Jordan, and they farm the home place and have four children: Connie married Richard Garza and have two children in Mason City, Kay married Larry Dose and have two children in Rochester, Sandra married Gary Tuttle, son of Robert and Ramona Tuttle, and have one son in California, and Gary married Lynne Steele and live in Colorado. Glendon, born 1930, married Rose Phillips and have four children: Teresa, Amy, Phillip and Curtis.

Myra Stark, born 1895, married Joe Benda, born 1897, and they farmed in Sec. 27 of Jamestown Twp., three miles east of Riceville, the farm where Capt. James Bennett preempted in 1855.

Roy Stark, born 1900, married Myrtle Torney, born 1905, daughter of Isaiah and Linnie Wallace Torney, and they farmed the home place five miles east of Riceville. They have three sons: Kenneth H., Harold and Dean. Kenneth H., born 1927, married Mary J. Louvar, born 1930, daughter of Jerry and Mayme Kakac Louvar of Saratoga and they farm in Sec. 9 of Jamestown Twp. and have three daughters: Betty married Steve Brooks

and have one son in Missouri, Diane married Larry Gronewold and have one daughter of Hampton, and Judy at UNI. Harold, born 1931, married Mary E. Husen and operate the Packard Elevator and have two sons: Steve married Ann Trenkle and have one daughter at Packard, and Doug married Sara Kolthoff and live near Greene. Dean, born 1939, married Helen Louvar, born 1938, daughter of Jerry and Mayme Kakac Louvar of Saratoga and they farm the home place and had three children: Susan of LaCrosse, Greg farming at home, and Larry died at age 9.


FRED VOIGHTMANN




