Former State Legislator Ray Logue Dies

Masonic Memorial services for Rayman Logue, 64, Marengo, were held at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, March 5, at the Masonic Temple, Marengo.

Logue, a former state legislator, died early Sunday, March 3, 1985, at Marengo Memorial hospital of a heart condition. He had been hospitalized since Saturday afternoon.

Marvin Miller, past master, Marengo, gave the Masonic memorial service. A memorial fund has been established for Marengo Memorial hospital.

There will be a cremation committal at a later date.

Born June 23, 1920 at Roundup, Mont., Rayman Logue was the son of Charles B. and Emma E. Matusick Logue. He graduated from Chariton high school in 1937.

His marriage to Cleo Nolan took place June 28, 1941 in Chariton. They had lived in Guthrie Center before moving to Marengo.

Logue saw action in the Pacific Theater during World War II. He served in the Marine Corps from 1944 to 1946.

As commercial manager for Iowa

Electric Light and Power company in this area, Logue served a number of the area communities after moving here in 1958. Later he served as IE's right-of-way and easement representative.

A state representative, he served in the 63rd General Assembly in 1969-1970 and in the 65th General Assembly, 1973 to 1974, representing this area.

Logue was a past president of both the Marengo Chamber of Commerce and Marengo Rotary club. He was a member of the Marengo Masonic lodge and frequently was in demand as a master of ceremonies for area events including the Farm and City dinners in Marengo. Santa Claus was the role he assumed before Christmas for a number of years for the annual appearance at the Marengo Legion hall.

Survivors in addition to his wife include one daughter, Karee E. (Mrs. DeWayne) Roggentine, Louisville, Ky., and one son, Michael N. (Rusty) Logue, Louisville, Colo.; one sister Lucille Wheeler, Cherokee, and five grandchildren, April and Eric Roggentine and Melissa, Michael and Nathan Logue.
