He represented the Waterloo district in the 64th General Assembly as a State Representative and in the 65th General Assembly as a State Senator.

Survivors include his wife; a son, Matthew Schwieger of Stanford, California; a daughter, Anne Schwieger of Ithaca, New York; a brother, Carlyn Schwieger of Dows; a brother-in-law, William F. McIntee of Richmond, Illinois; and many nieces and nephews.


