

Herman Miller Family

Herman William Miller, son of Louis and Caroline Miller, was born Feb. 6, 1875 in Harlan County. When he was but a few months old, his parents moved to Crawford County, Nebr. and settled on a farm 5½ miles north of Manilla in East Boyer Township.

On March 5, 1901 he was united in marriage with Minnie Steckelberg of Manilla. Minnie, the daughter of Charles and Margaret Steckelberg was born May 13, 1883 near Manilla. The couple met at the Evangelistic Camp meetings that were held in the Flint Grove (later known as the Ross Penniston farm) one mile north of Manilla. They began farming south of Manilla. Nine years later they purchased a farm 1½ miles west of Manilla. They moved a house from Astor which was their home until they built a new home in 1925. Their four children are: Selma (Mrs. Louis Vennink), Lucille (Mrs. Melroy Carstens), Alvin of Manilla, Arno (deceased June 23, 1983).

Herman died June 15, 1930. His wife, Minnie, continued to manage the farm business until her sons graduated from school and could operate the farm. In 1942, she moved to Manilla and continued to be active in church and community projects. She was an active 4-H Leader for many years. When the Manilla Manor was opened for residents in April 1976, she moved to the Manor, where she continues to make her home. She celebrated her 100th birthday there on May 13, 1983.

Hugh E. Miller Family

Hugh E. Miller was born July 14, 1892, to Charles and Minnie Olive Thompson Miller. Hugh moved to Minnesota in 1920, where he was a farmer and lumberman.

On March 19, 1934, Hugh married Hazel Chambers. They lived near International Falls, Minn.

This union was blessed with six children: Betty Steinbeck, Rosalea Kaski, Carolyn Lasen, Margaret Johnson, Evelyn Castle and Hugh E. Miller Jr.

His brothers and sister were Nellie, Frank, Bill, Jack, Eli, Guy, and Clarence Miller.

Hugh passed away Nov. 28, 1984.

John C. Miller Family

John Christopher Miller was born in 1822, in Hamburg, Germany. In 1850, he married Anna Emiline Harger, in Hamburg. On April 29, 1852, they came to America by boat, docking in New York. He was a shoe-maker by trade.

In 1855, the family traveled to Iowa, by wagon train. They lived in Davenport, Tipton, Mechanicsville, and finally Manilla.



Louis T. Miller Family

Louis Theodore Miller was born Feb. 13, 1844 in Seckeritz, Pommerania, Germany. The first 24 years of his life was spent in Germany. In 1864, at the age of 20, he was drawn into the German army and served three years, taking part in the war against Austria in 1866. He was discharged from service in 1867.

In 1868, at the age of 24, he emigrated to the United States, locating at Garnerville, Clayton, Ia. On July 18 of the same year, he was married to Caroline Kohn at Garnerville. They made their home at Garnerville for the next four years. In 1872, they moved to Orleans, Nebr. which was their home for 2½ years, until Oct. 1875 when they moved to Iowa again, locating on a farm in East Boyer Township, Crawford County. They continued to make their home there for the next 28 years. In March 1903 Mr. Miller retired from the farm and the family moved to Manilla.

Mr. and Mrs. Miller were the parents of ten children. One son, William, died in infancy. The other children are: Ida (Mrs. Henry Lochmiller); Amelia, (Mrs. Charles Saltwell); Herman; John; Bertha (Mrs. Herman Lochmiller); Alvena (Mrs. Louis Bohlander); Anna (Mrs. Frank Bohlander); Miss Augusta, and Elsie (Mrs. August Schuldt).

Mrs. Caroline Kohn Miller was born March 16, 1848 at Geiswald, Pommerania, Germany and died at her home in Manilla on Jan. 1, 1909.

Louis Miller died at his home in Manilla on April 3, 1929.

William A. Miller Family

William (Bill) Arthur Miller was married to Agnes Shaw in Pearshall, N.D. They had one daughter, Edith Olive Gruhn. Edith and her husband had three sons: Wayne, Stanley, and William.

Francis Mitzel Family

Edna Grau, daughter of Hugo and Anna Grau, was married to Francis Mitzel of Milbank, S.D. on Nov. 27, 1940.

Francis worked on the railroad for 17 years, and then at the Denison Hospital until his retirement. He passed away in Sept. of 1977.

They were the parents of two children, Janet and Karen. Janet is married to Jim Goeser and

they live in Harlan with their four children, Chris, Cari, Jay and Jeff. Karen and her husband Ralph Lampman live in Carroll.

Edna has worked with the school hot lunch program for 27 years.

Addison Morgan

Addison Morgan, who was born in Benton County on Oct. 17, 1855, moved to Shelby Co. in 1869.

He was united in marriage to Phillis Theobald on Dec. 27, 1877. Seven children were born to this union. A daughter, Edna, died in infancy.

Addison died in the Denison Hospital on Aug. 14, 1944, and is buried in the Nishnabotna Cemetery.

Phillis Theobald was born Dec. 29, 1857, at Middlebury, Wisc., and passed away Dec. 27, 1948, at St. Lawrence, S.D.

When she was 13 years old, the family moved to Crawford County. She spent the last six years of her life with her daughter, Clara, in St. Lawrence, where she is buried.

Cicero Morgan Family

One of Manilla's civic-minded people was Cicero Morgan. He was a son of Addison and Phillis (Theobald) Morgan, who had seven children. Cicero was born Oct. 13, 1879 and died Aug. 7, 1950. He married Lola Milligan on May 18, 1904. Cicero began his early married years as an express agent in Manilla from 1904 until 1930 when he was transferred to Carroll. Twelve years later he retired because of failing health and returned to Manilla.

Besides being a member of the Methodist Church, he was active in the Golden Leaf Lodge No. 595, a 32nd degree Mason, 1st worthy patron of the Order of Eastern Star, Manilla Chapter No. 408. Later he was a bookkeeper for the Saunders' Archery Target Co. For many years he was a photographer. At the time of his death, he was acting as city clerk and secretary of the 1950 Manilla School Board. Cicero was remembered as providing a job for a needy lad so he could go to college and also loaned money for him to finish. No man ever had a finer friend.

Cicero and Lola were the parents of a daughter, Phyllis Morgan, who was born April 16, 1917. She lives at the nursing home in Bayard.
