The Rock Island Company is now in possession of ample funds to push forward the completion of its line from Des Moines to Council Bluffs, a distance of 125 miles, with the utmost rapidity. The officers of the company are sanguine that this exten- sion will be finished in one year from the first of January 1868. It is proposed to lay steel rails from Des Moines to the Missouri river. And the company will be able to make an advance to the manufacturers of rails and locomotives, thereby purchasing below the market price, and getting all their work done on the lowest possible terms and in the quickest time.—*Chicago Tribune.*

No new developments in the Stanton case. Stanton expresses his determination to hold his office. It is not believed that the President will resort to extreme measures.

From Richmond.

Richmond, 17.

In the Convention Judge Underwood introduced a resolution in favor of giving franchise and right to hold office to every male citizen, and made a long speech in support of it.

From Jackson.

Jackson, 17.

A resolution was offered to the Convention that all persons are entitled to equal political rights, and forbidding property qualification forever from debarring dwellers from the privileges of citizens.

From Montgomery.

Montgomery, 17.

A meeting of the Conservative leading citizens of Alabama have been in session here two days. They recommended the people to abstain from voting entirely at the elections on the 4th and 5th of February next.

From Philadelphia.

Philadelphia, 17.

The Grand Army of the Republic are holding a convention, and have appointed Gen. Logan Commander in Chief. They passed resolutions in favor of Grant for President.

From Atlanta.

Atlanta, 17.

The Comptroller of State has been removed for having refused to recognize Gen. Wade's authority.


