A pharmacy or outsourcing facility may compound a preparation that is essentially a copy of an approved drug if the approved drug is identified as currently in shortage on the FDA drug shortages database published on the FDA Web site, http://www.accessdata.fda.gov/scripts/drugshortages/default.cfm.
