Auditor of State Rob Sand today released a report on the Iowa Department of Public Safety for the year ended June 30, 2022.

The Iowa Department of Public Safety is a statewide organization charged with promoting the safety of all Iowans from hazards associated with crime, fire and traffic through law enforcement.

AUDIT FINDINGS:

Sand reported three findings related to the reporting of the GAAP Package, procurement cards and targeted small business quarterly reports. The findings are found on pages 3 and 4 of this report. The Department's responses to the recommendations are included in the report.

Management of the Iowa Department of Public Safety has a fiduciary responsibility to provide oversight of the Department's operations and financial transactions. Oversight is typically defined as the "watchful and responsible care" management exercises in its fiduciary capacity.

To Stephan Bayens, Commissioner of the Iowa Department of Public Safety:

The Iowa Department of Public Safety is a part of the State of Iowa and, as such, has been included in our audits of the State's Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) and the State's Single Audit Report for the year ended June 30, 2022.

In conducting our audits, we became aware of certain aspects concerning the Department's operations for which we believe corrective action is necessary. As a result, we have developed recommendations which are reported on the following pages. We believe you should be aware of these recommendations, which include findings pertaining to the Department's internal control and statutory compliance and other matters. These recommendations have been discussed with Department personnel and their responses to the recommendations are included in this report. While we have expressed our conclusions on the Department's responses, we did not audit the Iowa Department of Public Safety's responses and, accordingly, we express no opinion on them.

This report, a public record by law, is intended solely for the information and use of the officials and employees of the Iowa Department of Public Safety, citizens of the State of Iowa and other parties to whom the Iowa Department of Public Safety may report. This report is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

Finding Reported in the State's Single Audit Report:

No matters were noted.

Findings Reported in the State's Report on Internal Control:

No matters were noted.

Other Findings Related to Internal Control:

(1) <u>Financial Reporting</u>

<u>Criteria</u> – A deficiency in internal control over financial reporting exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements of the financial statements on a timely basis. Properly designed policies and procedures and implementation of the policies and procedures are an integral part of ensuring the reliability and accuracy of the State's financial statements.

Departments record receipts and disbursements in the Integrated Information for Iowa (I/3) system throughout the year, including the accrual period. Activity not recorded in the I/3 system is reported to the Iowa Department of Administrative Services – State Accounting Enterprise (DAS–SAE) in a GAAP package. The GAAP package is to be submitted to DAS–SAE by the first week of September each year.

<u>Condition</u> – The following conditions were noted:

- (a) The Department understated equipment by \$81,403. This amount was properly adjusted for reporting purposes.
- (b) The Department overstated rental expense for leases by \$92,751.

<u>Cause</u> – Although policies and procedures are in place to review GAAP package information, the review did not identify the noted misstatements.

 $\underline{\mathrm{Effect}}$ – The amounts reported as equipment and rental expense by the Department were misstated.

<u>Recommendation</u> – The Department should implement additional procedures to ensure information reported to DAS-SAE on the GAAP package is accurate.

<u>Response</u> – The Department will ensure information reported to DAS-SAE in the GAAP Package is accurate.

<u>Conclusion</u> – Response accepted.

(2) Procurement Cards (P-Cards)

<u>Criteria</u> – The Department utilizes P-Cards for use by employees for Department business. Procurement cards are to be paid within 30 days of the statement date as required by the Purchasing Card Policy and Procedures Manual.

<u>Condition</u> – Nine monthly procurement statements tested were not paid within 30 days of the statement date as required by the Purchasing Card Policy and Procedures Manual.

<u>Cause</u> – Procedures have not been designed and implemented to ensure procurement charges are paid timely.

<u>Recommendation</u> – The Department should develop procedures to ensure all procurement charges are paid within 30 days of the statement date as required.

<u>Response</u> – The Department has made changes in procedures to help ensure all procurement charges are paid within 30 days of the statement date.

<u>Conclusion</u> – Response accepted.

Findings Related to Statutory Requirements and Other Matters:

(1) <u>Targeted Small Businesses</u> – Chapter 73.16 of the Code of Iowa requires the Director of each state agency or department of state government (state agency) having purchasing authority, in cooperation with the Targeted Small Business (TSB) Marketing and Compliance Manager of the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA), to establish a procurement goal for certified targeted small businesses each fiscal year. The procurement goal shall include the procurement of goods and services, including construction, but excluding utility services. The goal shall be stated in terms of a dollar amount and at a level exceeding the procurement levels from certified targeted small businesses during the previous fiscal year.

Departments with an established TSB procurement goal are required to report the dollar amount of purchases from certified targeted small businesses to the TSB Marketing and Compliance Manager of the IEDA within 15 business days following the end of each calendar quarter.

The Department did not provide two of the four required quarterly reports to the TSB Marketing and Compliance Manager of the IEDA within 15 business days as required.

<u>Recommendation</u> – The Department should ensure quarterly reports are submitted to the TSB Marketing and Compliance Manager of the IEDA within 15 business days, as required.

<u>Response</u> – The Department will ensure quarterly TSB reports are submitted timely, as required.

<u>Conclusion</u> – Response accepted.
