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Auditor of State Mary Mosiman today released a report on the Iowa Public Information Board for the year ended June 30, 2017.

The Board was created by the Iowa Legislature as a body to provide Iowans an alternative means to receive information and resolve complaints regarding the requirements of Chapters 21 and 22 of the Code of Iowa, the laws governing open meetings and public records, including a process to secure compliance with and enforcement of these requirements.

Mosiman recommended the Board review its policies and procedures over certain statutory requirements related to targeted small business procurement levels and board member appointment to ensure compliance with Code of Iowa requirements. The Board's responses to the recommendations are included in the report.

The Iowa Public Information Board is a part of the State of Iowa and, as such, has been included in our audit of the State's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the year ended June 30, 2017.

In conducting our audit, we became aware of aspects concerning the Board's operations for which we believe corrective action is necessary. As a result, we have developed recommendations which are reported on the following page. We believe you should be aware of these recommendations which pertains to the Board's compliance with statutory requirements and other matters. These recommendations have been discussed with Board personnel and their responses to these recommendations are included in this report. While we have expressed our conclusions on the Board's responses, we did not audit the Iowa Public Information Board's responses and, accordingly, we express no opinion on them.

Findings Reported in the State's Single Audit Report:

Findings Related to Statutory Requirements and Other Matters:

- (1) Targeted Small Business Procurement Goals – Chapter 73.16 of the Code of Iowa requires the Director of each state agency or department of state government (state agency) having purchasing authority, in cooperation with the Targeted Small Business (TSB) Marketing and Compliance Manager of the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA), to establish a procurement goal for certified targeted small businesses each fiscal year. The procurement goal shall include the procurement of goods and services, including construction, but excluding utility services. The goal shall be stated in terms of a dollar amount and at a level exceeding the procurement levels from certified targeted small businesses during the previous fiscal year.

The TSB procurement goal for Iowa Public Information Board was not submitted for fiscal year 2017.

Recommendation – The Iowa Public Information Board should establish a dollar amount procurement level exceeding the previous fiscal year certified targeted small businesses procurement level as required or seek legislation to change this statutory requirement.

Response – The Iowa Public Information Board (IPIB) has set a TSB goal for fiscal year 2018. Given IPIB's limited budget and the small amount of goods and services purchased, compliance with this section will provide unique challenges to the agency.

Conclusion – Response accepted.

- (2) Board Member Appointment – Chapter 23.3 of the Code of Iowa establishes the Iowa Public Information Board which consists of nine members appointed by the governor. For six months of fiscal year 2017 there were only eight of nine board members appointed to the Iowa Public Information Board.

Recommendation – The Board should work with the Office of the Governor to appoint a ninth member to the Iowa Public Information Board.

Response – A ninth board member was appointed to the Iowa Public Information Board in July 2017.

Conclusion – Response accepted.
