1 2 as follows:
1 3 #1. Page 1, by inserting after line 1 the
1 4 following:

1 8 to read as follows:
1 9 257.17 AID REDUCTION FOR EARLY SCHOOL STARTS.
1 10 State aid payments made pursuant to section 257.16
1 11 for a fiscal year shall be reduced by one one=
1 12 hundred=eightieth for each day of that fiscal year for
1 13 which the school district begins school before the
1 14 earliest starting date specified in section 279.10,
1 15 subsection 1. However, this section does not apply to
1 16 a school district that has received approval from the
1 17 director of the department of education for a pilot
1 18 project under section 256.20, or for a pilot program
1 19 under section 279.10, subsection 4, to commence
1 20 classes for regularly established elementary and
1 21 secondary schools in advance of the starting date
1 22 established in section 279.10, subsection 1 3.>

1 25 <Sec. . Section 279.10, subsections 1 and 2,
1 26 Code 2005, are amended to read as follows:
1 27 1. The school year shall begin on the first day of
1 28 July and each regularly established elementary and
1 29 secondary school shall begin no sooner than ~~a day~~
1 30 ~~during the calendar week in which the first day of~~
1 31 ~~September falls August 25~~ but no later than the first
1 32 Monday in December unless the school district has
1 33 received approval from the department of education for
1 34 a pilot program or pilot project in accordance with
1 35 subsection 3 or section 256.20. However, if the first
1 36 day of September falls on a Sunday, school may begin
1 37 on a day during the calendar week which immediately
1 38 precedes the first day of September. School shall
1 39 continue for at least one hundred eighty days, except
1 40 as provided in subsection 3, and may be maintained
1 41 during the entire calendar year. However, if the
1 42 board of directors of a district extends the school
1 43 calendar because inclement weather caused the district
1 44 to temporarily close school during the regular school
1 45 calendar, the district may excuse a graduating senior
1 46 who has met district or school requirements for
1 47 graduation from attendance during the extended school
1 48 calendar. A school corporation may begin employment
1 49 of personnel for in-service training and development
1 50 purposes before the date to begin elementary and
2 1 secondary school.

2 3 hearing on any ~~proposal request made pursuant to~~
