A licensee holding and releasing ungulates 34 4 35 shall construct and maintain boundary fences 4 4 36 prescribed by the department so as to enclose and 37 contain all released ungulates and exclude all 4 38 ungulates which are property of the state from 4 4 39 becoming a part of the hunting preserve enterprise. 4 40 b. A person who begins to keep game swine on or after the effective date of this Act shall construct 4 41 4 42 and maintain a fence in compliance with this 43 paragraph.
