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1 1 Amend House File 722 as follows:  
1 2 #1. Page 4, by inserting after line 19, the  
1 3 following:  
1 4 <Sec. \_\_\_\_\_. Section 464A.11, subsection 2,  
1 5 unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2009, is amended to read  
1 6 as follows:  
1 7 In administering the water trails and low head dam  
1 8 public hazard program, the department shall conduct a  
1 9 study of waterways for recreational purposes and  
1 10 develop a statewide plan by ~~January 1~~ March 31, 2010.  
1 11 Elements of the plan shall include but not be limited  
1 12 to:  
1 13 Sec. \_\_\_\_\_. Section 481A.19, subsection 1, paragraph  
1 14 b, Code 2009, is amended to read as follows:  
1 15 b. Any person licensed by the authority of  
1 16 Illinois, Minnesota, Missouri, Wisconsin, Nebraska, or  
1 17 South Dakota to take fish, game, mussels, or  
1 18 fur-bearing animals from or in lands under the  
1 19 jurisdiction of any of those states may take such  
1 20 fish, game, mussels, or fur-bearing animals from or in  
1 21 lands under the jurisdiction of the commission when  
1 22 such land is ~~wholly surrounded by adjacent to that~~  
1 23 respective state but is separated from other land in  
1 24 Iowa by a body of water, without having procured a  
1 25 license from the director of this state, in the same  
1 26 manner that persons holding Iowa licenses may do, if  
1 27 the laws of Illinois, Minnesota, Missouri, Wisconsin,  
1 28 Nebraska, or South Dakota, respectively, extend a  
1 29 similar privilege to persons so licensed under the  
1 30 laws of Iowa.  
1 31 Sec. \_\_\_\_\_. Section 481A.19, subsection 2, Code  
1 32 2009, is amended to read as follows:  
1 33 2. Any privileges conferred by this section shall  
1 34 be subject to a reciprocal agreement as negotiated by  
1 35 the commission and the authority of a state provided  
1 36 in subsection 1 which confers upon a licensee of this  
1 37 state reciprocal rights, privileges, and immunities as  
1 38 provided in section 483A.31. Such agreements may  
1 39 include determination of which state's seasons and  
1 40 limits shall apply for specific geographical areas.>  
1 41 #2. Page 22, lines 7 and 8, by striking the words  
1 42 ~~<based on the populations of deer using a~~  
1 43 ~~county-by-county system>~~ and inserting the following:  
1 44 <based on the populations of deer>.  
1 45 #3. Page 24, by inserting after line 23 the  
1 46 following:  
1 47 <Sec. \_\_\_\_\_. NEW SECTION. 483A.9A COMBINATION  
1 48 PACKAGES OF LICENSES.  
1 49 1. The commission is authorized, pursuant to rules  
1 50 adopted under chapter 17A, to develop combination  
2 1 packages of licenses in order to offer incentives to  
2 2 residents to purchase additional licenses or for the  
2 3 specific purpose of increasing sales of licenses that  
2 4 will help to recruit or retain hunters, anglers, and  
2 5 trappers in the state.  
2 6 2. The total cost of each combination package of  
2 7 licenses offered shall be less than the total cost of  
2 8 the licenses if each was purchased separately.>  
2 9 #4. Page 26, by inserting after line 13, the  
2 10 following:  
2 11 <Sec. \_\_\_\_\_. Section 484B.10, Code 2009, is amended  
2 12 by adding the following new subsection:  
2 13 NEW SUBSECTION. 3. A nonresident youth under  
2 14 sixteen years of age may hunt game birds on a licensed  
2 15 hunting preserve upon securing an annual hunting  
2 16 preserve license restricted to hunting preserves only  
2 17 for a license fee of five dollars and payment of the  
2 18 wildlife habitat fee. A nonresident youth is not  
2 19 required to complete the hunter safety and ethics  
2 20 education course to obtain a hunting preserve license  
2 21 pursuant to this subsection if the youth is  
2 22 accompanied by a person who is at least eighteen years  
2 23 of age, is qualified to hunt, and possesses a valid  
2 24 hunting license. During the hunt, the accompanying

2 25 adult must be within arm's reach of the nonresident  
2 26 youth.>  
2 27 #5. Page 27, by inserting after line 8 the  
2 28 following:  
2 29 <Sec. \_\_\_\_\_. UPLAND GAME BIRD STUDY ADVISORY  
2 30 COMMITTEE. An upland game bird study advisory  
2 31 committee is established for the purpose of studying  
2 32 the best ways to restore sustainable and socially  
2 33 acceptable populations of pheasants and quail in the  
2 34 state to maximize the economic value of upland game  
2 35 bird hunting to Iowa's economy while balancing the  
2 36 needs of the agricultural industry.  
2 37 1. The advisory committee shall be composed of the  
2 38 following members:  
2 39 a. One representative from each of the following  
2 40 organizations or entities who, if possible, is  
2 41 involved with policy decisions for that organization  
2 42 or entity, to be appointed by the governor:  
2 43 (1) Iowa association of county conservation  
2 44 boards.  
2 45 (2) Iowa farm bureau federation.  
2 46 (3) Iowa farmers union.  
2 47 (4) Iowa conservation alliance.  
2 48 (5) Pheasants forever.  
2 49 (6) Quails forever.  
2 50 (7) Iowa hospitality association.  
3 1 (8) Izaak Walton league.  
3 2 (9) Iowa realtors association.  
3 3 (10) The department of transportation.  
3 4 (11) Iowa chapter of the sierra club.  
3 5 (12) Iowa sportsmen's federation.  
3 6 (13) Outdoor writer's association.  
3 7 (14) A person who represents a farm land  
3 8 management company.  
3 9 (15) Two persons who are farmers, one who farms in  
3 10 northern Iowa and one who farms in southern Iowa.  
3 11 (16) Two persons who hunt upland game birds, one  
3 12 who resides in northern Iowa and one who resides in  
3 13 southern Iowa.  
3 14 b. Two legislative staff members, one from the  
3 15 staff of United States Senator Tom Harkin and one from  
3 16 the staff of United States Senator Charles Grassley,  
3 17 or their designees.  
3 18 c. The director of the department of natural  
3 19 resources, or a designee.  
3 20 d. The secretary of agriculture, or a designee.  
3 21 e. The director of the department of economic  
3 22 development, or a designee.  
3 23 f. A representative of the United States fish and  
3 24 wildlife service.  
3 25 g. The executive director of the farm service  
3 26 agency, or a designee.  
3 27 i. A member of the state soil conservation  
3 28 committee, or a designee.  
3 29 j. A representative of the Iowa state university  
3 30 fisheries and wildlife cooperative unit.  
3 31 k. Two members of the senate, one of whom is  
3 32 appointed by the majority leader of the senate and one  
3 33 of whom is appointed by the minority leader of the  
3 34 senate.  
3 35 1. Two members of the house of representatives,  
3 36 one of whom is appointed by the speaker of the house  
3 37 of representatives and one of whom is appointed by the  
3 38 minority leader of the house of representatives.  
3 39 2. The director of the department of natural  
3 40 resources or the director's designee shall serve as  
3 41 the chairperson of the advisory committee.  
3 42 3. Legislative members of the committee are  
3 43 eligible for per diem and reimbursement of actual  
3 44 expenses as provided in section 2.10.  
3 45 4. The committee shall review, analyze, and make  
3 46 recommendations on issues relating to the state's  
3 47 upland game bird population, including but not limited  
3 48 to the following:  
3 49 a. The current status of Iowa's upland game bird  
3 50 populations and harvest and habitat management  
4 1 programs.  
4 2 b. Current farm programs and their impact on  
4 3 upland game bird populations.  
4 4 c. The economic impact and value of Iowa's upland  
4 5 game bird populations to Iowa.

4 6 d. Upland game bird population challenges and  
4 7 programs in other midwestern states.  
4 8 e. New and innovative ways to restore sustainable  
4 9 populations of Iowa's upland game birds.  
4 10 f. An assessment of public opinion concerning the  
4 11 impact and value of Iowa's upland game bird  
4 12 populations.  
4 13 5. The advisory committee shall complete its  
4 14 deliberations in December 2009 and submit a final  
4 15 report to the governor and the general assembly  
4 16 summarizing the committee's activities, analyzing the  
4 17 issues studied, and including any other information or  
4 18 recommendations that the committee deems relevant and  
4 19 necessary by January 10, 2010. Copies of the final  
4 20 report shall be sent to the national resource  
4 21 conservation service, the United States fish and  
4 22 wildlife service, and to members of Iowa's  
4 23 congressional delegation.  
4 24 Sec. \_\_\_\_\_. EFFECTIVE DATE. The section of this Act  
4 25 establishing the upland game bird study advisory  
4 26 committee, being deemed of immediate importance, takes  
4 27 effect upon enactment.>
