Senate Amendment 3234

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Amend House File 805, as amended, passed, and 2 reprinted by the House, as follows:
3 #1. Page 4, by inserting after line 30 the 4 following: NEW SECTION. 321.179 DRIVER EDUCATION <Sec. 6 == TEACHING PARENT. TEACHING PARENT. As an alternative to the 8 driver education requirements under section 321.178, a 9 teaching parent may instruct a student in a driver 10 education course that meets the requirements of this 11 section and provide evidence that the requirements 12 under this section have been met. DEFINITIONS. For purposes of this section: "Approved course" means driver education 13 2. 14 a. 1 15 curriculum approved by the department pursuant to 16 rules adopted under chapter 17A. An approved course 17 shall, at a minimum, meet the requirements of 18 subsection 3 and be appropriate for teaching= 19 parent=directed driver education and related street or 20 highway instruction. Driver education materials that 21 meet or exceed standards established by the department 22 for an approved course in driver education for a 23 public or private school shall be approved unless 24 otherwise determined by the department. The list of 25 approved courses shall be posted on the department's 26 internet website. 27 b. "Student" means a person between the ages of 28 fourteen and twenty=one years who is within the 29 custody and control of the teaching parent and who 30 satisfies preliminary licensing requirements of the 31 department. 1 32 c. "Teaching parent" means a parent, guardian, or 33 legal custodian of a student who is currently 34 providing competent private instruction to the student 35 pursuant to section 299A.2 or 299A.3 and who provided 36 such instruction to the student during the previous 37 year; who has a valid driver's license, other than a 38 motorized bicycle license or a temporary restricted 39 license, that permits unaccompanied driving; and who 40 has maintained a clear driving record for the previous 41 two years. For purposes of this paragraph, "clear 42 driving record" means the individual has not been 43 identified as a candidate for suspension of a driver's 44 license under the habitual offender provisions of the 45 department's regulations; is not subject to a driver's 46 license suspension, revocation, denial, cancellation, 47 disqualification, or bar; and has no record of a 48 conviction for a moving traffic violation determined 1 49 to be the cause of a motor vehicle accident. 3. COURSE OF INSTRUCTION.
a. An approved course administered by a teaching 50 2 parent shall consist of, but not be limited to, the 3 following: Thirty clock hours of classroom instruction. (2) Forty hours of street or highway driving 6 including four hours of driving after sunset and 7 before sunrise while accompanied by the teaching 8 parent. (3) Four hours of classroom instruction concerning 10 substance abuse. (4) A minimum of twenty minutes of instruction 12 concerning railroad crossing safety. 13 (5) Instruction relating to becoming an organ 14 donor under the revised uniform anatomical gift Act as 15 provided in chapter 142C. (6) Instruction providing an awareness about 16 17 sharing the road with bicycles and motorcycles.
18 b. The content of the course of instruction 19 required under this subsection shall be equivalent to 20 that required under section 321.178. However, 21 reference and study materials, physical classroom

22 requirements, and extra vehicle safety equipment 23 required for instruction under section 321.178 shall 24 not be required for the course of instruction provided 2 25 under this section.

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4. COURSE COMPLETION AND CERTIFICATION. Upon 2 27 application by a student for an intermediate license, 28 the teaching parent shall provide evidence showing the 29 student's completion of an approved course and 30 substantial compliance with the requirements of 31 subsection 3 by affidavit signed by the teaching 32 parent on a form to be provided by the department. 33 The evidence shall include all of the following:

a. Documentation that the instructor is a teaching 35 parent as defined in subsection 2.

b. Documentation that the student is receiving 37 competent private instruction under section 299A.2 or 38 the name of the school district within which the 39 student is receiving instruction under section 299A.3.

The name of the approved course completed by c. 41 the student.

An affidavit attesting to satisfactory 43 completion of course work and street or highway 44 driving instruction.

e. Copies of written tests completed by the 46 student.

f. A statement of the number of classroom hours of 48 instruction.

g. A log of completed street or highway driving 50 instruction including the dates when the lessons were $\ensuremath{\text{1}}$ conducted, the student's and the teaching parent's 2 name and initials noted next to each entry, notes on 3 driving activities including a list of driving 4 deficiencies and improvements, and the duration of the 5 driving time for each session.

5. INTERMEDIATE LICENSE. Any student who 7 successfully completes an approved course as provided 8 in this section, passes a driving test to be 9 administered by the department, and is otherwise 10 qualified under section 321.180B, subsection 2, shall 11 be eligible for an intermediate license pursuant to 12 section 321.180B. Twenty of the forty hours of street 13 or highway driving instruction required under 14 subsection 3, paragraph "a", subparagraph (2), may be 15 utilized to satisfy the requirement of section 16 321.180B, subsection 2.

6. FULL LICENSE. A student must comply with 18 section 321.180B, subsection 4, to be eligible for a 19 full driver's license pursuant to section 321.180B. Section 321.180B, subsection 2, Code Sec. ___.

21 2009, is amended to read as follows:

2. INTERMEDIATE LICENSE.

a. The department may issue an intermediate 2.3 24 driver's license to a person sixteen or seventeen $25\ \text{years}$ of age who possesses an instruction permit $26\ \text{issued}$ under subsection $1\ \text{or}$ a comparable instruction 27 permit issued by another state for a minimum of six 28 months immediately preceding application, and who 29 presents an affidavit signed by a parent or guardian 30 on a form to be provided by the department that the 31 permittee has accumulated a total of twenty hours of 32 street or highway driving of which two hours were 33 conducted after sunset and before sunrise and the 34 street or highway driving was with the permittee's 35 parent, guardian, instructor, a person certified by 36 the department, or a person at least twenty=five years 37 of age who had written permission from a parent or 38 guardian to accompany the permittee, and whose driving 39 privileges have not been suspended, revoked, or barred 40 under this chapter or chapter 321J during, and who has 41 been accident and violation free continuously for, the 42 six=month period immediately preceding the application 43 for an intermediate license. An applicant for an 44 intermediate license must meet the requirements of 45 section 321.186, including satisfactory completion of 46 driver education as required in section 321.178 or 321.179, and payment of the required license fee 48 before an intermediate license will be issued.

49 <u>b.</u> A person issued an intermediate license must 50 limit the number of passengers in the motor vehicle 1 when the intermediate licensee is operating the motor 2 vehicle to the number of passenger safety belts.

Except as otherwise provided, a person issued 4 an intermediate license under this subsection who is 5 operating a motor vehicle between the hours of

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6 twelve=thirty a.m. and five a.m. must be accompanied
   7 by a person issued a driver's license valid for the
   8 vehicle operated who is the parent or guardian of the
4 9 permittee, a member of the permittee's immediate 4 10 family if the family member is at least twenty=one
  11 years of age, an approved driver education instructor,
  12 a prospective driver education instructor who is
  13 enrolled in a practitioner preparation program with a
4 14 safety education program approved by the state board
  15 of education, or a person at least twenty=five years
  16 of age if written permission is granted by the parent
  17 or guardian, and who is actually occupying a seat
  18 beside the driver. However, a licensee may operate a
  19 vehicle to and from school=related extracurricular
  20 activities and work without an accompanying driver
  21 between the hours of twelve=thirty a.m. and five a.m.
  22 if such licensee possesses a waiver on a form to be
  23 provided by the department. An accompanying driver is
  24 not required between the hours of five a.m. and
  25 twelve=thirty a.m.>
