## H-820 4

Amend House File 2380 as follows:

1. By striking page 5 , line 6 , through page 10 , line 24 , and inserting:

Sec. - TEACHER PERFORMANCE, INSTRUCTIONAL TIME, AND SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION - COMMISSION REPORT.
l. A teacher evaluation, performance, and career development commission is created to develop recommendations for measures to improve teacher evaluation, teacher performance, and career development opportunities for teachers; changes to the minimum requirements for a school day and school year; and measures to equalize school transportation costs for school districts, including but not limited to a review of alternative transportation funding methods that can provide stronger incentives for districts to operate their transportation systems efficiently. With regard to instructional time, the commission shall review the following:
a. Whether the minimum length of an instructional day should be extended and, if so, whether the instructional day should be extended for all students or for specific groups of students.
b. Whether the minimum number of instructional days or hours in a school year should be increased and, if so, whether the minimum number of days or hours in a school year should be increased for all students or for specific groups of students.
c. Whether the minimum number of instructional days or hours should be rearranged to result in a shorter summer break, with other days or weeks off throughout the school year.
d. Whether the minimum school year should be defined by a number of days or by a number of instructional hours.
e. Whether there should be a uniform, statewide start date for the school year that can only be waived for the purpose of implementing an innovative educational program.
f. Whether resources necessary to extend the minimum length of an instructional day or the minimum length of a school year are justified when compared to competing education priorities.
2. The commission shall consist of eleven voting members and five ex officio, nonvoting members appointed by July l, 2012, as follows:
a. The voting members shall be members of the general public appointed as follows:
(1) One member shall be appointed by the governor.
(2) Two members shall be appointed by the president of the senate.
(3) One member shall be appointed by the minority leader of the senate.
(4) Two members shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
(5) One member shall be appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives.
(6) One member representing public postsecondary education institutions who is employed by a public postsecondary education institution and who shall be appointed by the governor.
(7) Three members representing three different school districts who shall be appointed by the governor as follows:
(a) One member shall be a teacher employed by a school district or area education agency who is appointed from a list of three names submitted by a certified employee organization representing teachers licensed under chapter 272.
(b) One member shall be an administrator employed by a school district who is appointed from a list of three names submitted by a statewide organization representing administrators licensed under chapter 272.
(c) One member shall be a member of a board of directors of a school district who is appointed by a statewide organization representing schools boards.
b. The ex officio, nonvoting members shall be appointed as follows:
(l) One member who is a member of the state board of education appointed by the chairperson of the state board of education.
(2) One member who is a member of the senate shall be appointed by the president of the senate.
(3) One member who is a member of the senate shall be appointed by the minority leader of the senate.
(4) One member who is a member of the house of representatives shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
(5) One member who is a member of the house of representatives shall be appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives.
c. In appointing members to the commission, proper consideration shall be given to persons with experience or special knowledge in one or more of the following areas: education, business, technology, and finance.
d. The initial meeting of the commission shall
be convened by the member representing the public postsecondary education institutions. The commission
members shall elect a chairperson from among the voting members of the commission.
e. A majority of the voting members constitutes a quor um for the transaction of any official business.
f. Commission appointments shall be made in a manner which provides geographical representation and complies with sections 69.16, 69.16A, and 69.16C.
g. Public members of the commission are entitled to receive reimbursement for actual expenses incurred while engaged in the performance of official duties. Legislators' expenses shall be paid from funds appropriated by section 2.12 .
3. The department of education shall provide staffing assistance to the commission.
4. The commission shall submit its findings and recommendations in a report to the general assembly by December l, 2012.
