MEDICAL CANNABIDIOL

6 Section 124.401, subsection 5, Code 2014, 7 is amended by adding the following new unnumbered 8 paragraph after unnumbered paragraph 2:

NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. A person may knowingly 10 or intentionally recommend, possess, use, dispense, 11 deliver, transport, or administer cannabidiol if the 12 recommendation, possession, use, dispensing, delivery, 13 transporting, or administering is in accordance with 14 the provisions of chapter 124D. For purposes of this 15 paragraph, "cannabidio1" means the same as defined in 16 section 124D.2.

NEW SECTION. 124D.1 Short title. Sec. This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the 19 "Medical Cannabidiol Act".

124D.2 Definitions. Sec. . NEW SECTION. As used in this chapter:

- "Cannabidiol" means a nonpsychoactive 23 cannabinoid found in the plant Cannabis sativa L. 24 or Cannabis indica or any other preparation thereof 25 that is essentially free from plant material, and has 26 a tetrahydrocannabinol level of no more than three 27 percent.
- "Department" means the department of public 2. 29 health.
- "Intractable epilepsy" means an epileptic seizure 3. 31 disorder for which standard medical treatment does 32 not prevent or significantly ameliorate recurring, 33 uncontrolled seizures or for which standard medical 34 treatment results in harmful side effects.
- "Neurologist" means an allopathic or osteopathic 36 physician board-certified in neurology in good standing 37 and licensed under chapter 148 or an allopathic or 38 osteopathic physician board-certified in neurology in 39 good standing and licensed in any other state.
- "Primary caregiver" means a person, at least 5. a. 41 eighteen years of age, who has been designated by a 42 patient's neurologist or a person having custody of a 43 patient, as being necessary to take responsibility for 44 managing the well-being of the patient with respect 45 to the medical use of cannabidiol pursuant to the 46 provisions of this chapter. A patient may have one or 47 more designated primary caregivers.
- "Primary caregiver" includes but is not limited 48 b. 49 to the following:
 - (1) An employee of a hospice program, if the

1 employee meets the definition of a primary caregiver 2 under paragraph "a".

(2) An individual providing home and 4 community-based services, and including a home health 5 agency, licensed, certified, or otherwise authorized 6 or permitted by the law of this state or another state 7 to administer health care in the ordinary course of 8 business or in the practice of a profession, if the 9 individual meets the definition of a primary caregiver 10 under paragraph \tilde{a} .

NEW SECTION. 124D.3 Neurologist 12 recommendation — medical use of cannabidiol.

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A neurologist who has examined and treated a patient 13 14 suffering from intractable epilepsy may provide but 15 has no duty to provide a written recommendation for 16 the patient's medical use of cannabidiol to treat or 17 alleviate symptoms of intractable epilepsy if no other 18 satisfactory alternative treatment options exist for 19 the patient and all of the following conditions apply:

- The patient is a permanent resident of this 1. 21 state.
- 2. The neurologist or another neurologist has 23 treated the patient for intractable epilepsy for at 24 least six months.
- The neurologist has tried alternative treatment 26 options that have not alleviated the patient's 27 symptoms.
- The neurologist determines the risks of 28 29 recommending the medical use of cannabidiol are 30 reasonable in light of the potential benefit for the 31 patient.
- 32 5. The neurologist maintains a patient treatment 33 plan.

NEW SECTION. 124D.4 Cannabidiol 34 Sec. 35 registration card.

- Issuance to patient. The department may approve 37 the issuance of a cannabidiol registration card by the 38 department of transportation to a patient who:
 - a. Is at least eighteen years of age.
 - Is a permanent resident of this state. b.
- 41 Provides the department with a written C.42 recommendation signed by a neurologist that the 43 patient may benefit from the medical use of cannabidiol 44 pursuant to section 124D.3.
- Submits an application to the department, on a 46 form created by the department, in consultation with 47 the department of transportation, that contains all of 48 the following:
- The patient's full name, Iowa residence 50 address, date of birth, and telephone number.

- (2) A copy of the patient's valid photo 2 identification.
- (3) Full name, address, and telephone number of the 4 patient's neurologist.
- (4) Full name, residence address, date of birth, 6 and telephone number of each primary caregiver of the 7 patient, if any.
 - (5) Any other information required by rule.
 - 2. Patient card contents. A cannabidiol
- 10 registration card issued to a patient by the department 11 of transportation pursuant to subsection 1 shall 12 contain, at a minimum, all of the following:
- The patient's full name, Iowa residence address, 13 14 and date of birth.
 - The patient's photo. b.

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- 16 c. The date of issuance and expiration date of the 17 registration card.
 - d. Any other information required by rule.
- 19 Issuance to primary caregiver. For a patient in 20 a primary caregiver's care, the department may approve 21 the issuance of a cannabidiol registration card by the 22 department of transportation to the primary caregiver 23 who:
 - Is at least eighteen years of age. a.
- 25 Provides the department with a written 26 recommendation signed by a neurologist that a patient 27 in the primary caregiver's care may benefit from the 28 medical use of cannabidiol pursuant to section 124D.3.
- Submits an application to the department, on a 30 form created by the department, in consultation with 31 the department of transportation, that contains all of 32 the following:
- 33 The primary caregiver's full name, residence (1)34 address, date of birth, and telephone number.
 - The patient's full name. (2)
- 36 (3) A copy of the primary caregiver's valid photo 37 identification.
- (4) Full name, address, and telephone number of the 39 patient's neurologist. 40
 - (5) Any other information required by rule.
- 41 4. Primary caregiver card contents. A cannabidiol 42 registration card issued by the department of 43 transportation to a primary caregiver pursuant to 44 subsection 3 shall contain, at a minimum, all of the 45 following:
- 46 The primary caregiver's full name, residence 47 address, and date of birth.
 - The primary caregiver's photo.
- The date of issuance and expiration date of the 49 50 registration card.

- 1 d. The full name of each patient in the primary 2 caregiver's care.
 - e. Any other information required by rule.
- 5. Expiration date of card. A cannabidiol registration card issued pursuant to this section shall expire one year after the date of issuance and may be renewed.
- 8 6. Card issuance department of transportation.
 9 The department may enter into a chapter 28E agreement
 10 with the department of transportation to facilitate the
 11 issuance of a cannabidiol registration card pursuant to
 12 subsections 1 and 3.
- Sec. NEW SECTION. 124D.5 Department duties 14 rules.
- 15 l. a. The department shall maintain a confidential 16 file of the names of each patient to or for whom the 17 department issues a cannabidiol registration card 18 and the name of each primary caregiver to whom the 19 department issues a cannabidiol registration card under 20 section 124D.4.
- 21 b. Individual names contained in the file shall be 22 confidential and shall not be subject to disclosure, 23 except as provided in subparagraph (1).
- 24 (1) Information in the confidential file maintained 25 pursuant to paragraph "a" may be released to the 26 following persons under the following circumstances:
- 27 (a) To authorized employees or agents of the 28 department and the department of transportation as 29 necessary to perform the duties of the department and 30 the department of transportation pursuant to this 31 chapter.
- 32 (b) To authorized employees of state or local 33 law enforcement agencies, but only for the purpose of 34 verifying that a person is lawfully in possession of a 35 cannabidiol registration card issued pursuant to this 36 chapter.
- 37 (2) Release of information pursuant to subparagraph 38 (1) shall be consistent with the federal Health 39 Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, 40 Pub. L. No. 104-191.
- 2. a. The department, in consultation with the department of transportation, shall adopt administrative rules under section 17A.4, subsection 3, and section 17A.5, subsection 2, paragraph "b", to implement the provisions of this chapter, subject to the prior approval of the administrative rules coordinator and the administrative rules review committee. Such rules shall become effective July 1, 2014, unless the effective date is delayed by the administrative rules review committee and shall expire

- 1 one hundred eighty days after the effective date.
- The rules adopted pursuant to this subsection 3 shall include but not be limited to rules to establish 4 all of the following:
- (1) Rules to establish the manner in which the 6 department shall consider applications for new and 7 renewal cannabidiol registration cards.
- (2) Rules to establish the manner in which 9 an out-of-state patient who possesses a written 10 recommendation of a treating neurologist that 11 specifically allows the patient to possess or 12 use cannabidiol to treat or alleviate symptoms of 13 intractable epilepsy in the jurisdiction of issuance 14 shall apply for and may be issued a temporary 15 cannabidiol registration card.
- _. <u>NEW</u> SECTION. 16 124D.6 Medical use of 17 cannabidiol — affirmative defense.

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- 1. a. A recommendation for the possession or use 19 of cannabidiol as authorized by this chapter shall be 20 provided exclusively by a neurologist for a patient who 21 has been diagnosed with intractable epilepsy.
- Cannabidiol provided exclusively pursuant to the b. 23 recommendation of a neurologist shall be obtained from 24 an out-of-state source and shall only be recommended 25 for oral or transdermal administration.
- A neurologist shall be the sole authorized 27 recommender as part of the treatment plan by the 28 neurologist of a patient diagnosed with intractable 29 epilepsy. A neurologist shall have the sole authority 30 to recommend the use or amount of cannabidiol, if any, 31 in the treatment plan of a patient diagnosed with 32 intractable epilepsy.
- 2. A neurologist, including any authorized agent 34 thereof, shall not be subject to prosecution for the 35 unlawful recommendation, possession, or administration 36 of marijuana under the laws of this state for 37 activities arising directly out of or directly related 38 to the recommendation or use of cannabidiol in the 39 treatment of a patient diagnosed with intractable 40 epilepsy.
- 41 3. *a.* In a prosecution for the unlawful possession 42 of marijuana under the laws of this state, including 43 but not limited to chapters 124 and 453B, it is an 44 affirmative and complete defense to the prosecution 45 that the patient has been diagnosed with intractable 46 epilepsy, used or possessed cannabidiol pursuant to a 47 recommendation by a neurologist as authorized under 48 this chapter, and, for a patient eighteen years of 49 age or older, is in possession of a valid cannabidiol 50 registration card.

- 1 b. In a prosecution for the unlawful possession 2 of marijuana under the laws of this state, including 3 but not limited to chapters 124 and 453B, it is an 4 affirmative and complete defense to the prosecution 5 that the person possessed cannabidiol because the 6 person is a primary caregiver of a patient who has 7 been diagnosed with intractable epilepsy and is in 8 possession of a valid cannabidiol registration card, 9 and where the primary caregiver's possession of the 10 cannabidiol is on behalf of the patient and for the 11 patient's use only as authorized under this chapter.
- 12 c. (1) The defenses afforded a patient under 13 paragraph "a" apply to a patient only if the quantity 14 of cannabidiol oil possessed by the patient does not 15 exceed thirty-two ounces.
- 16 (2) The defenses afforded a primary caregiver 17 under paragraph "b" apply to a primary caregiver only 18 if the quantity of cannabidiol oil possessed by the 19 primary caregiver does not exceed thirty-two ounces per 20 patient.
- 21 d. If a patient or primary caregiver is charged
 22 with the commission of a crime and is not in possession
 23 of the person's cannabidiol registration card, any
 24 charge or charges filed against the person shall be
 25 dismissed by the court if the person produces to the
 26 court at the person's trial a cannabidiol registration
 27 card issued to that person and valid at the time the
 28 person was charged.
- 4. An agency of this state or a political subdivision thereof, including any law enforcement agency, shall not remove or initiate proceedings to remove a patient under the age of eighteen from the home of a parent based solely upon the parent's or patient's possession or use of cannabidiol as authorized under this chapter.
 - Sec. ___. NEW SECTION. 124D.7 Penalties.

37 A person who knowingly or intentionally possesses or 38 uses cannabidiol in violation of the requirements of 39 this chapter is subject to the penalties provided under 40 chapters 124 and 453B.

41 Sec. __. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **124D.8 Repeal**. 42 This chapter is repealed July 1, 2017.

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Sec. ____. REPORT. The university of Iowa Carver defected of medicine and college of pharmacy shall, on or before July 1 of each year, beginning July 1, 2015, submit a report detailing the scientific literature, studies, and clinical trials regarding the use of cannabidiol on patients diagnosed with intractable epilepsy to the department of public health and the general assembly.
