## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to practitioner preparation programs, whole
- 2 grade sharing agreements, work-based learning opportunities,
- 3 and the before and after school grant program under the
- 4 purview of the department of education, the state board of
- 5 education, the board of educational examiners, and schools.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 85.20, subsection 3, Code 2017, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3. For a student participating in a work-based learning
- 4 opportunity as provided in section 85.61, against the student's
- 5 school district of residence, receiving school district if
- 6 the student is participating in open enrollment under section
- 7 282.18, accredited nonpublic school, community college,
- 8 and directors, officers, authorities, and employees of the
- 9 applicable school district corporation.
- 10 Sec. 2. Section 256.16, subsection 1, Code 2017, is amended
- 11 by adding the following new paragraphs:
- 12 NEW PARAGRAPH. d. Require that each student admitted to an
- 13 approved practitioner preparation program participate in field
- 14 experiences that include both observation and participation in
- 15 teaching activities in a variety of school settings. These
- 16 field experiences shall comprise a total of at least fifty
- 17 hours in duration, at least ten hours of which shall occur
- 18 prior to a student's acceptance in an approved practitioner
- 19 preparation program. The student teaching experience shall be
- 20 a minimum of fourteen weeks in duration during the student's
- 21 final year of the practitioner preparation program. The
- 22 program shall make every reasonable effort to offer the student
- 23 teaching experience prior to a student's last semester, or
- 24 equivalent, in the program, and to expand the student's student
- 25 teaching opportunities beyond one semester or the equivalent.
- 26 NEW PARAGRAPH. e. Require that faculty members in
- 27 professional education maintain an ongoing involvement in
- 28 activities in elementary, middle, or secondary schools. The
- 29 activities shall include at least forty hours of team teaching
- 30 during a period not exceeding five years in duration at the
- 31 elementary, middle, or secondary level.
- 32 NEW PARAGRAPH. f. Include instruction in skills and
- 33 strategies to be used in classroom management of individuals,
- 34 and of small and large groups, under varying conditions;
- 35 skills for communicating and working constructively with

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- 1 pupils, teachers, administrators, and parents; preparation in
- 2 reading theory, knowledge, strategies, and approaches, and
- 3 for integrating literacy instruction into content areas in
- 4 accordance with this section; and skills for understanding the
- 5 role of the state board and the functions of other education
- 6 agencies in the state. The requirement shall be based upon
- 7 recommendations of the department after consultation with
- 8 teacher education faculty members in colleges and universities.
- 9 NEW PARAGRAPH. g. Prescribe minimum experiences and
- 10 responsibilities to be accomplished during the student teaching
- 11 experience by the student teacher and by the cooperating
- 12 teacher based upon recommendations of the department after
- 13 consultation with teacher education faculty members in
- 14 colleges and universities. The student teaching experience
- 15 shall include opportunities for the student teacher to become
- 16 knowledgeable about the Iowa teaching standards, including
- 17 but not limited to a mock evaluation performed by the
- 18 cooperating teacher. The mock evaluation shall not be used as
- 19 an assessment tool by the practitioner preparation program.
- 20 The student teaching experience shall consist of interactive
- 21 experiences involving the college or university personnel, the
- 22 student teacher, the cooperating teacher, and administrative
- 23 personnel from the cooperating teacher's school district.
- 24 NEW PARAGRAPH. h. Offer annually a workshop of at least
- 25 one day in duration for prospective cooperating teachers. The
- 26 workshop shall define the objectives of the student teaching
- 27 experience, review the responsibilities of the cooperating
- 28 teacher, and provide the cooperating teacher with other
- 29 information and assistance the institution deems necessary.
- 30 The rules shall also require institutions providing approved
- 31 professional development programs to offer such a workshop
- 32 annually.
- 33 NEW PARAGRAPH. i. Provide practitioner preparation students
- 34 with instruction in the use of electronic technology for
- 35 classroom and instructional purposes.

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- NEW PARAGRAPH. j. Annually solicit the views of the education community regarding the institution's practitioner preparation programs.
- 4 NEW PARAGRAPH. k. Submit evidence that the college or
- 5 department of education in the institution is communicating
- 6 with other colleges or departments in the institution so that
- 7 practitioner preparation students may integrate teaching
- 8 methodology with subject matter areas of specialization.
- 9 NEW PARAGRAPH. 1. Submit evidence that the performance
- 10 evaluation of a student teacher is a cooperative process that
- 11 involves both the faculty member supervising the student
- 12 teacher and the cooperating teacher. The rules shall require
- 13 that each institution develop a written evaluation procedure
- 14 for use by the cooperating teacher and a form for evaluating
- 15 student teachers, and require that a copy of the completed form
- 16 be included in the student teacher's permanent record.
- 17 NEW PARAGRAPH. m. Enter into a written contract with
- 18 any school district, accredited nonpublic school, preschool
- 19 registered or licensed by the department of human services, or
- 20 area education agency in Iowa, to provide for such work under
- 21 terms and conditions as agreed upon by the contracting parties,
- 22 if the rules adopted by the board of educational examiners for
- 23 issuance of any type or class of license require an applicant
- 24 to complete work in student teaching, pre-student teaching
- 25 experiences, field experiences, practicums, clinicals, or
- 26 internships. The terms and conditions of a written contract
- 27 entered into with a preschool pursuant to this paragraph
- 28 shall require that a student teacher be under the direct
- 29 supervision of an appropriately licensed cooperating teacher
- 30 who is employed to teach at the preschool. Students actually
- 31 teaching or engaged in preservice licensure activities in a
- 32 school district under the terms of such a contract are entitled
- 33 to the same protection under section 670.8 as is afforded by
- 34 that section to officers and employees of the school district,
- 35 during the time such students are so assigned.

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- 1 Sec. 3. Section 282.10, Code 2017, is amended by adding the 2 following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 5. A whole grade sharing agreement signed
- 4 in accordance with subsection 4, and any amendment to such an
- 5 agreement, shall be filed with the department of education not
- 6 later than February 10 of the school year preceding the school
- 7 year for which the agreement, or amendment to the agreement,
- 8 is to take effect.
- 9 Sec. 4. REPEALS. Sections 256.26, 272.25, and 272.27, Code
- 10 2017, are repealed.
- 11 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 14 This bill transfers statutory provisions relating to
- 15 practitioner preparation programs from Code sections 272.25
- 16 and 272.27 to Code section 256.16, requires school districts
- 17 to file whole grade sharing agreements and amendments to such
- 18 agreements with the department of education, repeals the before
- 19 and after school grant program, and restores a word changed by
- 20 legislation enacted in 2016.
- 21 PRACTITIONER PREPARATION PROGRAMS STATE BOARD RULES. The
- 22 state board of education has a statutory duty to prescribe
- 23 standards and procedures for the approval of practitioner
- 24 preparation programs and professional development programs
- 25 offered in this state by practitioner preparation institutions
- 26 located within or outside this state and by area education
- 27 agencies. Currently, statutory provisions relating to the
- 28 state board's responsibility to adopt rules relating to
- 29 institutions that offer practitioner preparation programs and
- 30 professional development programs are located in Code chapters
- 31 256 (department of education) and 272 (educational examiners
- 32 board). The bill transfers such statutory language from Code
- 33 chapter 272 to Code section 256.16 (specific criteria for
- 34 teacher preparation and certain educators), and to remove
- 35 resulting redundancies, repeals Code sections 272.25 and

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- 1 272.27.
- 2 WHOLE GRADE SHARING AGREEMENTS FILING REQUIREMENT. Under
- 3 current law, each board of directors of a school district that
- 4 enters into a whole grade sharing agreement must sign the
- 5 agreement by February 1 of the school year preceding the school
- 6 year for which the agreement is to take effect. The bill
- 7 requires such school districts to submit the agreement, and any
- 8 amendment to the agreement, to the department of education not
- 9 later than February 10 of the school year preceding the school
- 10 year for which the agreement, or amendment to the agreement,
- ll is to take effect.
- 12 WORK-BASED LEARNING OPPORTUNITY CORPORATION. 2016
- 13 Iowa Acts, ch. 1108(13), House File 2392, replaced the word
- 14 "corporation" with "district" in Code section 85.20(3) but
- 15 because the sentence refers to a school district, accredited
- 16 nonpublic school, community college, and directors, officers,
- 17 authorities, and the employees of such, this bill restores the
- 18 more appropriate word, "corporation", to the sentence.
- 19 BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL GRANT PROGRAM REPEALED. The bill
- 20 repeals the before and after school grant program, which was
- 21 established to provide competitive grants to school districts
- 22 and other public and private organizations to expand the
- 23 availability of before and after school programs and summer
- 24 schools. The program has not received state funding since the
- 25 2008-2009 fiscal year.
