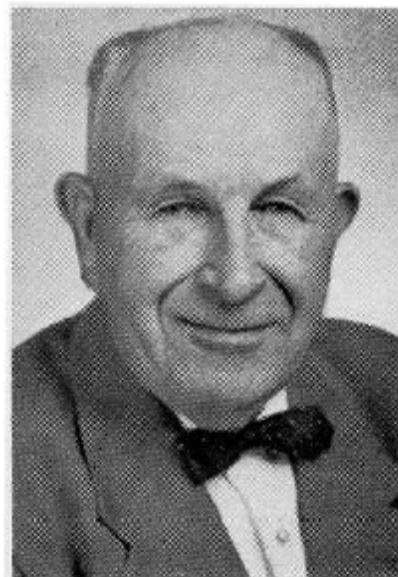


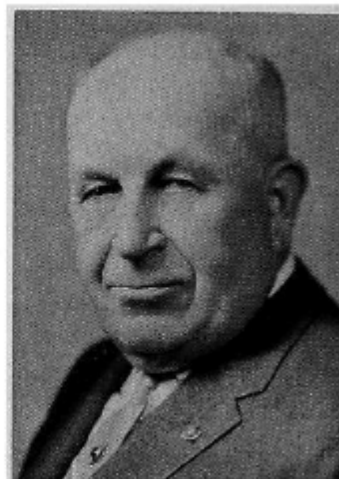
HOSCHEK, Carl, Burlington

County

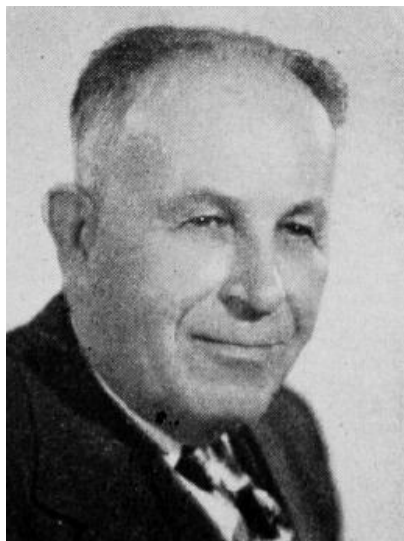
