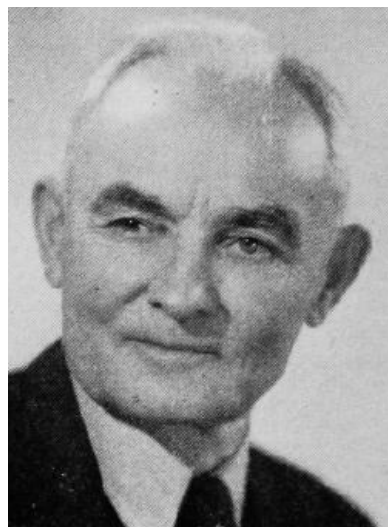


LANGLAND, C. M., Spring Grove, Minn.

Republican

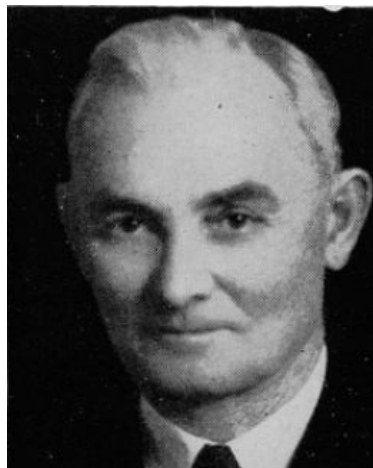

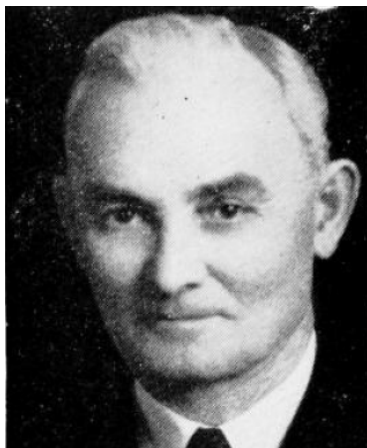

On October 1st, 1906, he assumed the duties of assistant cashier of the State Bank of Spring Grove, at Spring Grove, Minnesota, which position he held until March 1st, 1921. During this period the farm was run by means of a renter on shares. On September 12th, 1911, he married Miss Clara Elizabeth Hille, of Fergus Falls, Minnesota.
