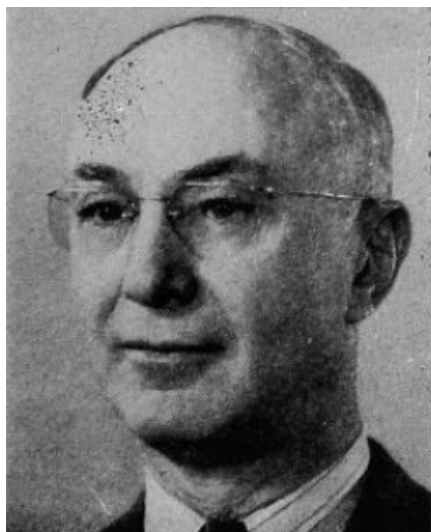
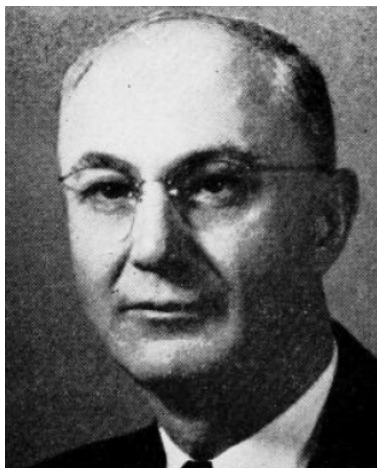




SCHLUTER, Edwin C. Republican
