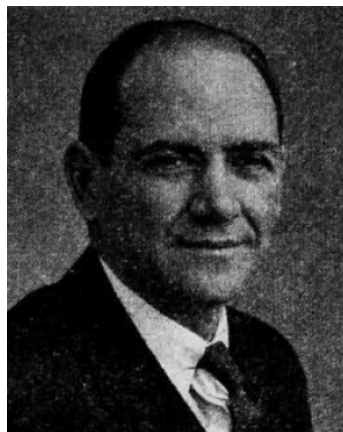




**TROEGER, Paul A., Ottumwa
Wapello County**

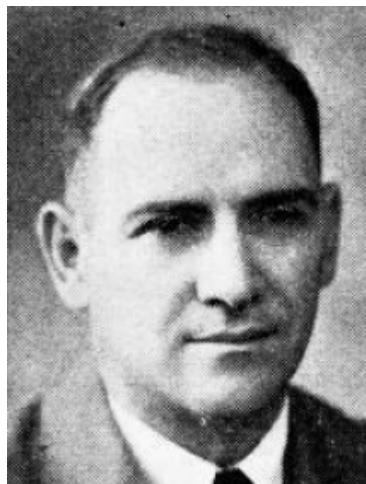
Republican
