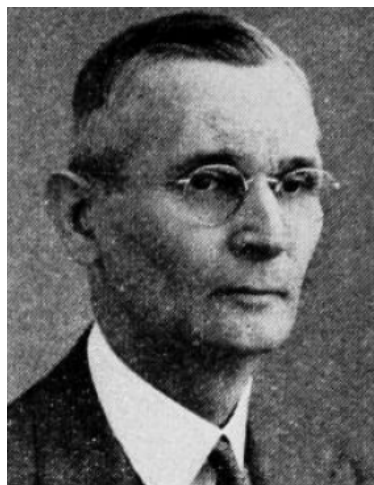




FULLER, D. D., Maquoketa

Post graduate work at the University of Iowa and Southern California University. Admitted to the bar in California and Iowa. Practiced law in Mason City, Iowa; referee in bankruptcy, central division, northern district of Iowa, at Mason City 1918-28; since 1929 engaged in banking. Vice president of Jackson State Savings Bank, Maquoketa. Widower; father of two children—D. D. (Jack) Fuller, chemical engineer, Whittier, California, and Dorothy Fuller, student at Mt.
