



IVER CHRISTOFFERSEN, Cedar Falls.—Representative from Black Hawk county, was born in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, on January 6, 1899. His parents, Hans J. Christoffersen and Mary (Jensen) Christoffersen, came to Iowa from Denmark in the early eighties. In 1930, he married Veronica Sedar and they have one child, Liane Mae. He has been a resident of Iowa practically his entire life, having resided on a farm for several years in Cass county and he has also lived in Corning, Winfield and Waterloo, Iowa, and is now a resident of Cedar Falls, Iowa. He graduated from Iowa State Teachers College with a B. A. degree in 1923, and from the college of law at the State University of Iowa in 1926.
