Served in the prosecuting attorney's office, Dubuque county, for six years and in the city attorney's office for six years. Married to Margaret Whelan. Served as senator from Dubuque county in the forty-fourth and forty-fifth general assemblies and was democratic leader and president pro tempore in the forty-fifth.
