Was elected representative in 1906, re-elected in 1908, 1910, and 1918. Is a democrat in politics.

Representative from Dubuque county, was born on a farm in Grant county, Wisconsin, February 5, 1861, of German parentage. Resided in that section until reaching his majority. In 1886 located in city of Dubuque. For the next four years he was engaged in several occupations, chiefly that of a stationary engineer and as a lime burner. In 1905 was elected business agent for the Teamsters' Union, Local 567, I. B. of T. of Dubuque, of which union he was president for three years, and for the past four years secretary-treasurer and business agent. Has been president of the Dubuque Trades and Labor Congress for six years, and is district organizer of the American Federation of Labor. Has for years been an active worker in labor circles. Elected Representative in 1906, re-elected in 1908 and 1910. A Democrat in politics.

B. of T. of Dubuque, of which union he was president for three years, and for the past two years secretary-treasurer and business agent. Has been president of the Dubuque Trades and Labor Congress for four years, and is district organizer of the American Federation of Labor. Has for years been an active worker in labor circles. Elected Representative in 1906 and re-elected in 1908. A Democrat in politics.

Has been president of the Dubuque Trades and Labor Congress for two years and district organizer of the American Federation of Labor. He has always been active in labor circles. Elected Representative in 1906. A Democrat in politics.
