## Iowa Department of Veterans Affairs Annual Report to Governor and Iowa General Assembly

As required in Iowa Code Chapter 35A.5 (14) regarding County Commissions of Veterans Affairs and the County Allocation Program authorized in Iowa Code Chapter 35A.16

### **BACKGROUND:**

The 2008 Iowa Acts, Chapter 1130, section 2 created the county commission of veterans affairs fund. The purpose of this fund is to assist county commissions of veterans affairs in complying with legislative requirements for employing a county veteran service officer who is nationally accredited through the National Association of County Veterans Service Officers (NACVSO); who is occupied in veterans affairs for a minimum number of hours; and who maintains an office in a location owned or leased by the county.

Funding is appropriated annually to the department for the program, and the department disperses the funds to the counties by check. The Iowa General Assembly has appropriated \$947,925 annually to fund the program (through FY18).

The department annually allocates \$10k (or the appropriation amount divided by 99) to each county from the fund. In order to qualify for the allocation, a county must agree to expend the allocation for the administration and maintenance of the county commission of veterans affairs office, and the county must agree to maintain its current level of spending from the previous fiscal year.

Iowa Code requires each participating county to submit a detailed report to the department at the end of the fiscal year in which the allocation was received. The department then analyzes the information to determine how services to veterans have been increased. This information is then used to prepare a report to the Governor and Iowa General Assembly.

### **FINDINGS:**

The most beneficial use of these funds has been the opportunity for county service officers to be trained (to receive initial accreditation and continuing education) even if they need to travel, as county travel budgets are limited. The funds have provided the opportunity for the improved expertise needed to file federal benefit claims and appeals.

These funds have been instrumental in providing outreach to veterans in all counties, computer equipment, internet access, copy machines, fax machines, scanners, paper and postage supplies, and office furniture in order to conduct interviews and file claims for veterans.

The funds are also used for the important task of advertising office location and hours, new benefit information, and opportunities to attend information sessions.

**RECOMMENDATIONS:**

This program has been in place for nearly 13 years, so the time is right for the Iowa General Assembly to review the effectiveness of the program. It is difficult for the department to measure "increased services to veterans" that can be attributed to this program. There are many variables that impact how well veterans are served in each county.

The department recommends a significant change that would provide greater flexibility to the county while also ensuring accountability at the county level. This change would include code language to outline the authorized expenditures for this specific appropriation. Since every county has different needs, this would provide the broad legislative intent and leave the decision making to the county officials.
