Iowa Code Section 80.48

In accordance with the Code of Iowa, Section 80.48, this annual report provides the following:

- A list of all expenditures from the fund made in previous fiscal years.
- The amount of moneys in the fund carried over from the previous fiscal year to the current fiscal year and how the Department of Public Safety plans to use those moneys, including any expenditures in the current fiscal year.
- The amount of moneys in the fund the Department of Public Safety intends to carry over from the current fiscal year to the next fiscal year and how the Department of Public Safety plans to use those moneys.
- A list of all the sources of moneys deposited in the fund in the previous fiscal year.

HISTORY OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY EQUIPMENT FUND

On June 17, 2021, Governor Kim Reynolds signed <u>House File 708</u> (HF 708), which created the Public Safety Equipment Fund. HF 708 created a new section in Chapter 80 of the Iowa Code, §80.48, which established a Public Safety Equipment Fund in the state treasury under the control of the Department of Public Safety. The legislation further specified that the moneys in the fund are appropriated to the Department for the "purchase, maintenance, and replacement of equipment used by the department." §80.48(1).

Significant for the Department, the bill stipulates in §80.48(2) that moneys remaining in the fund at the close of the fiscal year "shall not revert but shall remain available for expenditure for the purposes designated." This "non-reverting" proviso enables the Department to plan and save for equipment expenses from year to year.

The 89th General Assembly appropriated a total of \$5 million to the Public Safety Equipment Fund for use in FY 2022. The appropriations consisted of \$2.5 million from the Rebuilding Iowa Infrastructure Fund (HF 862) and \$2.5 million from the General Fund (HF 861).

The Department's equipment needs are and will continue to be significant. Before the Public Safety Equipment Fund, the Department was compelled to hold open vacancies and then use the resulting savings to procure the equipment necessary for our personnel to perform their core duties and keep them safe. By bestowing the Department with dedicated funds for these otherwise prohibitive expenses, the legislature has liberated the resources the Department needed to begin fully staffing its divisions. The Department will now be able focus its resources on attracting and keeping good people in law enforcement.

Approximately 98% of the Department's annual budget is dedicated to salaries and benefits, motor vehicle purchases, and infrastructure obligations. The remaining 2% must cover all other equipment costs.
