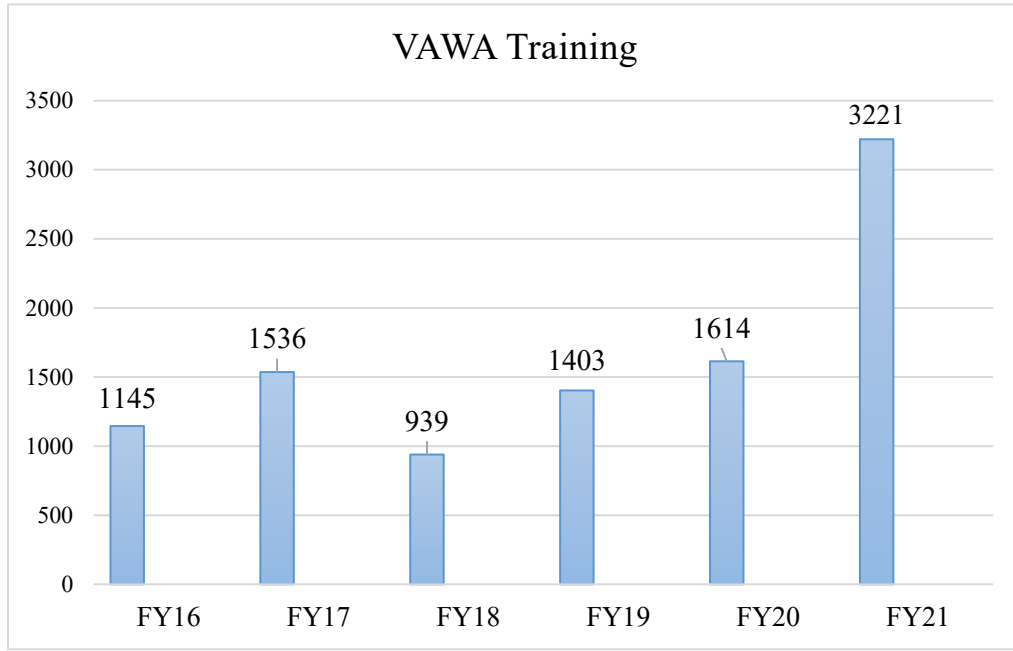
## **Iowa Law Enforcement Council Domestic Abuse Training Report**

The Iowa Law Enforcement Academy has a STOP Violence Against Women grant that is 75% funded through the state of Iowa Attorney General's Office. This funded program allows our instructor to travel statewide to provide training on topics of domestic violence and sexual assault. In FY 2021, the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy provided:

- Domestic Abuse Training:
  - Response to Domestic Violence and Environmental Dynamics
    - Cycle of Violence
    - Power of Control Wheel
    - Strangulation
  - On-Scene Investigation and Response with the Victim and Suspect
  - No Contact Orders/ Protection Orders

## STOP Violence against Women (VAWA)

In FY21, the Academy held 70 training sessions and trained 3, 221 personnel with this grant.
