

# Volunteer Iowa (Iowa Commission on Volunteer Service) Quarterly Report: April 1 – June 30, 2022

#### AmeriCorps

Volunteer Iowa has awarded federal and state AmeriCorps funding that will leverage private and local funding for a total of over \$15 million, an increase of \$3 million compared to last year's awards. This funding will support over 800 AmeriCorps State members who will be eligible to earn over \$2.7 million worth of Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards for their service. (After completing a full term of service, AmeriCorps members receive an award of approximately \$6,500 that they can use to pay for college or to pay off student loans.

AmeriCorps State grants provide funding to local organizations to support AmeriCorps members meeting critical community needs in the areas of education, disaster services, health, environmental stewardship, and economic opportunity.

In addition to the program grants listed below, Volunteer Iowa also approved the award of planning grant funding to be made available during a competition taking place in summer-fall 2022.

#### Commission Business

Outgoing Commissioners: Volunteer Iowa held its commission meeting on Tuesday, May 17. During the meeting, the commission bid farewell to four commissioners whose terms have expired. Cherian Koshy, Leah Rodenberg, Anderson Sainci, and Kerry Walter Ashby made tremendous contributions to the commission during their terms of service, and they will be greatly missed. Angela Jiskoot was elected as chair of the commission and Dan Cataldi was elected vice chair. They both begin their leadership positions on July 1, 2022.

#### Iowa Mentoring Partnership (IMP)

- Two Excellence in Mentoring Awards were presented on April 21, 2022, to outstanding youth mentors for service as mentors and mentor advocates.
- Two programs completed their National Quality Mentoring Assessment and were granted certification.
- Staff received training to become National Mentoring Resource Center technical assistance providers to local programs.

#### Career Mentoring Updates:

- 48 additional students (from 12 different colleges) enrolled in virtual career mentoring during the '21-'22 academic year
- The number of enrolled mentors in the workforce increased to 77 each of the eligible fields are represented, with the majority being in Information Technology (26) and Healthcare (25), which corresponds with student demand
- 766 Mentoring Activities were captured in the Chronus E-Mentoring Platform (e.g., goals completed, resume review)
- 131.3 Hours Were Spent in Virtual Meetings in the platform
- 100+ Meetings and professional development activities occurred beyond the e-mentoring platform, including attendance at conferences and job site visits
- 390 Instant messages were exchanged between matches
- Student testimonials include employment and internships owed to engagement in the program
- Several updates were made to the existing curriculum to drive match engagement

### • Service Enterprise

Volunteer Iowa obtained recertification from Points of Light as a Certified Service Enterprise, which is effective through the end of 2024. The Iowa Department for the Blind received Service Enterprise Re-Certification, and applications are being accepted for a new training cohort this fall.

#### Volunteer Generation Fund

 A grant from Youth Service America was again received for a partnership between Volunteer Iowa, the Department for Human Rights, and the Iowa Afterschool Alliance to provide training and resources to support youth service and service learning. An AmeriCorps VISTA member has been recruited to help lead the project and will begin service in August.

#### Disaster

 Several trainings are being planned for next quarter that will address the growing percentage of turnover in the disaster field by having targeted trainings with newly onboarded Volunteer Center Staff and leaders.

#### Youth Service & Service-Learning

Olunteer Iowa hosted two sessions for Global Youth Service Day (April 29-May 1). One session was for Iowa schools on best practices for creating a meaningful student voluntary service (silver cord) program. Volunteer Iowa also hosted a virtual professional development session for high school students, college students, and AmeriCorps members on how to leverage volunteer experience on resumes and/or college applications. Additionally, we discussed careers related to service and the nonprofit sector.
