## Iowa Tuition Grant Program – FY23

Iowa Code section 261.15(4) requires the submission of an annual report on the Iowa Tuition Grant Program as follows:

261.15(4). Make an annual report to the governor and general assembly, and evaluate the tuition grant for the period. The commission may require the accredited private institution to promptly furnish any information which the commission may request in connection with the tuition grant program.

The lowa Tuition Grant provides need-based grant assistance to eligible students attending lowa's private colleges and universities. Staff determines the award parameters, including the annual funded maximum award, in the spring prior to the academic year for which the funding will be disbursed. This gives colleges and universities the ability to inform current and prospective students of estimated financial aid for the upcoming academic year.

In fiscal year 2023, Iowa Tuition Grants were awarded to 8,300 unduplicated students, with awards averaging \$6,014.
