# lowa Lottery Report On Operations

## Introduction

The lowa Lottery achieved record results in fiscal year 2023 and continues to build upon that strong performance in FY 2024.

The initial five-month period of the current fiscal year has achieved year-over-year increases in Lottery sales, proceeds, prizes to players and retailer compensation. The results are led by increased sales of tickets in instant-scratch games as well as Powerball® and Mega Millions®.

It is gratifying to see the results achieved by the lowa Lottery team and its retail and vendor partners, who are responsibly delivering an entertainment option statewide while producing significant results for the lowa causes that rely upon Lottery proceeds for funding.

The lowa Lottery will continue to monitor larger economic factors that can impact Lottery performance as they do lowa household budgets and businesses. At the same time, the Lottery's staff and partners will continue to concentrate on game development, prize innovations and operational integrity to ensure that the Lottery can continue to meet the expectations of lowa decision-makers and consumers into the future.

This bi-annual Report on Operations details the Lottery's latest work and financial results.

## FY 2023 Final Results

The lowa Lottery established new high-water marks in multiple categories in FY 2023, finishing the year with records for $\$ 481.5$ million in sales, $\$ 305.3$ in prizes to players, $\$ 108.4$ million in proceeds to state causes, and $\$ 31.3$ million in commissions to retailers from the sale of traditional Lottery products.

In addition, the Lottery's operating expenses remained well below budget for the year.
The time period of FY 2021-2023 is now the most successful three years in lowa Lottery history. They are the only years in which total annual lowa Lottery sales exceeded $\$ 430$ million while the Lottery surpassed $\$ 97$ million in annual proceeds for the State of lowa.

The lowa Lottery is in strong position and extends sincere thanks to its staff, retailers, customers and policymakers for their continued support of Lottery entertainment in lowa.

Iowa Lottery sales in FY 2023 increased 11.3 percent from the previous year's total of $\$ 432.7$ million. Lottery proceeds to state causes in FY 2023 increased 10.7 percent from the previous year's total, and prizes to players increased 11.3 percent from the previous year's record. Lottery sales commissions to lowa businesses increased 10.8 percent from the previous year.

The Lottery's FY 2023 results were positively impacted by many factors, including a rebound in sales of scratch games and significant jackpots in national lotto games.

The jackpots in Mega Millions® and


Powerball® simultaneously topped the $\$ 400$
million mark in October 2022, with the Powerball prize continuing to grow to a world-record
$\$ 2.04$ billion for that game's drawing on November 7, 2022.
The simultaneous huge jackpots generated a corresponding surge in sales in both games.
Lotto America, a smaller multi-state lotto game, also saw a sales surge for the year. Its jackpot reached $\$ 40.04$ million, a record for that game, in its drawing on April 1, 2023. A Dubuque man won the jackpot that night.

Sales of scratch games, which have always been the lowa Lottery's leading product, rebounded in FY 2023 after falling the previous year amid surging fuel prices and inflationary pressures. Increased fuel costs historically have had the most direct impact on the sale of scratch games among the Lottery's products.

As fuel prices and other economic pressures eased in FY 2023 and new games were introduced, scratch-ticket sales gradually rebounded in lowa. The product category finished the year up slightly, with scratch-ticket sales representing about 61 percent of total Iowa Lottery annual sales.

Sales of InstaPlay games also experienced record levels with total sales of $\$ 31.8$ million, a 35.8 percent increase over fiscal year 2022.

A highlight for FY 2023 was the $\$ 2.5$ million the Lottery raised for the lowa Veterans Trust Fund to benefit the state's veterans and their families. Through FY 2023, the Lottery had raised nearly $\$ 37.4$ million for the Veterans Trust Fund since it began providing proceeds to that cause in 2008.

The Lottery also provided proceeds during the fiscal year to the Public Safety Survivor Benefits Fund and Department of Corrections Survivor Benefits Fund, which help with ongoing insurance costs for the families of lowa peace officers, fire fighters and corrections employees who die in the line of duty.

## FY 2024 Initial Results



Annual Lottery sales and proceeds through November, the latest full month for which results are available, are running ahead of FY 2023's record pace.

Additionally, through the first five months of FY 2024, the lowa Lottery's operational expenses remained below budgeted projections. The Lottery's November financial statement is included in this report as Attachment B.

Scratch games were the Lottery's largest sales category in the initial months of FY 2024, accounting for 57.8 percent of all sales through November. With larger economic pressures overall continuing to ease, scratch-ticket sales as a whole were up 9.5 percent through November.

The lotto category accounted for 34.7 percent of total FY 2024 sales through November. Sales of those games were bolstered by strong results in Powerball and Mega Millions, which both saw large jackpots early in the fiscal year. Through the years, the Lottery has emphasized to state policymakers that sales in multi-jurisdictional lotto games are subject to peaks and valleys that correspond with the games' jackpot prize amounts.

Lottery proceeds for the first five months of FY 2024 totaled $\$ 49.4$ million, a 3.1 percent year-over-year increase.

The lowa Lottery remains confident that it will achieve the organization's stated goals for the current fiscal year. It continues to budget conservatively while proactively seeking to identify issues and trends that may affect future Lottery revenues.

## FY 2024 Budget Details

With the passage of the 2023 government alignment legislation, the lowa Lottery on July 1 became a division of the lowa Department of Revenue. The lowa Lottery's budget is now reported to the director of the Department of Revenue and included in the Department's overall budget for the year.

The lowa Lottery projects a 6.9 percent increase in revenues, expenses and proceeds for FY 2024 from its FY 2023 budget. Expenses for tickets, prizes, retailer compensation, advertising, gaming system operation and Lottery terminal communications are directly related to sales, and as sales projections increase, those expense items increase as well.

The Lottery's FY 2024 budget reflects an anticipated increase in projected sales due to new product offerings, additional self-service kiosk machines and an improved economic environment for consumers. The Lottery's FY 2024 figures also reflect a new contract rate for pull-tab vending machine maintenance.

Also of note, the Lottery's workplace rental expenses for its locations in Ankeny, Cedar Rapids, Mason City and Storm Lake were moved to the amortization expense line item under updated governmental accounting standards.

## Appropriate Gifting at the Holidays



As it has done for the past several years, the lowa Lottery in December 2023 participated in an national holiday effort designed to minimize the risks associated with youth gambling.

The annual Gift Responsibly campaign is organized by the National Council on Problem Gambling and the National Association of State and Provincial Lotteries. The "Gift Responsibly" image shown here was part of the lowa Lottery's 2023 messaging.

In the campaign, the Lottery noted that problem gambling can begin in adolescence when impulse and attention control are still developing. The Lottery emphasized that it wants its products to go to those who are mature enough to enjoy that entertainment.

To provide a larger perspective, the Lottery notes that age restrictions apply to many different products. The content of some video games and movies is not appropriate for all ages. Alcohol and tobacco-related products have age restrictions. Even toys have age-recommendation guidelines.

In lowa, consumers must be at least 21 years old to buy Lottery tickets, and the lowa Lottery has always considered its products something for adults. The Lottery's holiday message includes the reminder that people are gambling when they play the Lottery.

## Review of Lottery Drawing Processes

The lowa Lottery is conducting a review of its drawing procedures after a human reporting error caused the winning numbers for the Powerball drawing on November 27 to be reported incorrectly in lowa. This led to a delay in the drawing results in the state for several hours.

The Powerball drawing involved was conducted correctly as scheduled with official results produced, but redundant reporting procedures failed after the drawing. The mistake impacted only the lowa Lottery's reporting of the official results for that drawing. All other Lottery tickets could be purchased, checked and cashed as usual at Lottery terminals across the state and the results for all other Lottery drawings were recorded correctly.

The mistake initially caused the lowa Lottery to report incorrect results from the drawing on its statewide gaming system, website, mobile app and winning numbers telephone line. The incorrect results went live about 12:30 a.m. November 28 and remained available until 7:07 a.m. that day. Lottery staffers at that time noticed the error, removed the incorrect results from the central gaming system, website and other reporting locations. The results for the Powerball drawing also were suspended on lowa Lottery terminals, knowing that correcting the information on the statewide gaming system would take longer.

The Lottery went live with corrected official results about 3:30 p.m. November 28 and resumed cashing Powerball tickets at that time.

During the early-morning hours that the incorrect numbers were available on the Lottery system, a total of six tickets with the incorrect Powerball numbers were paid a prize. The total amount paid on those tickets was $\$ 69$.

There also were five tickets presented at retail locations during that time that had the correct winning numbers and were unable to accurately be paid their winnings. The lowa Lottery has since paid the largest of the prizes from those tickets for $\$ 200$. Four other tickets winning $\$ 100$ or less did not receive accurate prize payments that morning. The Lottery is ready to assist those players, should they reach out.

While the number of people potentially impacted by the situation is small, the lowa Lottery wants to hear from any players who have questions or concerns about the drawing. They are welcome to contact an lowa Lottery Security staffer by calling 515-725-7900 or emailing to wmaster@ialottery.com.

In addition, lowa Lottery CEO Matt Strawn has directed Iowa Lottery staff to work with its gaming systems partner, Scientific Games, to jointly conduct an independent, third-party review of both entities' respective reporting processes for the Powerball drawing on November 27.

A bedrock principle for delivering on the Lottery's promise to lowans centers on operational integrity. The Lottery demonstrated its commitment to that principle by being transparent in identifying, fixing and publicly communicating about the mistake.

That work will continue in the third-party review. It will include a survey of reporting processes utilized in other Lottery jurisdictions, and provide any recommendations about how drawing processes may be improved to prevent the type of human error that occurred on November 27.

This is an important step in ensuring the operational integrity of all lowa Lottery draw games going forward.

## Lottery Security Compliance

An important component of the Lottery's security and integrity efforts throughout any year are the unannounced security checks conducted at retail locations by the Lottery's Security Department.


During the compliance checks, undercover lowa Lottery investigators visit retail locations and pose as customers presenting Lottery tickets for validation and payment. The investigators also ensure that the placement of Lottery equipment is in compliance with requirements.

In FY 2023, the Lottery's investigators exceeded the annual performance target of conducting compliance checks in at least 20 percent of the Lottery's approximately 2,500 licensed retail locations.

## Two Prizes of \$2 Million Unclaimed In Iowa

This is a first: There now are two unclaimed prizes of $\$ 2$ million each in lowa, both in the Powerball game.

Many will remember that in September, a $\$ 1$ million Mega Millions prize won in Ames expired without being claimed.

The money from Lottery prizes that expire in lowa without being claimed goes into the Lottery's prize pools for future games and promotions. So in the instance of the Ames prize, the money went into the Lottery's Million Dollar Holiday holiday promotion that is currently underway and will be given away in that promotion's drawings.


Both of the $\$ 2$ million unclaimed prizes have been available for some time. The first was won in Tiffin in the Powerball drawing on October 7, and the second was won in Clinton in the Powerball drawing on November 25.

There is still plenty of time for these prizes to be claimed. But the lowa Lottery is reminding players to double-check their tickets. It will continue to send out updates about the prizes if they remain unclaimed.

The first of the $\$ 2$ million prizes will expire April 4 if it isn't claimed in time and the other will expire May 23.
